

Executive Summary

Study Objectives

Afghanistan is an important neighbor of Pakistan, it however, has unfortunately been in turmoil for the past 5-decades severely impacting Pakistan's development especially in its western provinces which border Afghanistan.

Peace and prosperity in Afghanistan are imperative for peace and prosperity in Pakistan. This study from the Pakistan Business Council (PBC) looks at trade and investment as a means for bringing peace and prosperity in the region. Trade promotion being the primary objective, this study analyzes Pakistan-Afghanistan's bilateral trade; Afghanistan's trade with its neighbors and Afghanistan's trade with other important countries in the region i.e., India, China, Turkey, Kazakhstan and the United Arab Emirates (UAE).

Not only is there potential for growing Pakistan-Afghanistan bilateral trade, Afghanistan can also become a major transit route for trade between Pakistan and the Central Asia Republics.

1: Introduction to Afghanistan

Cultural and Historical Context

Afghanistan is a culturally rich and diverse nation with a Muslim-majority population and comprising various ethnic groups. The country has a long-recorded history, marked by significant events such as invasions by Alexander the Great, the Mongols, the British, and the Soviet Union, along with political shifts from monarchy to the current Taliban regime.

Demographic Outlook of Afghanistan (2022-2023)

(i). Population Growth and Urbanization

Afghanistan's population increased from 41.13 million in 2022 to 42.24 million in 2023, reflecting a growth rate of 2.67%. The urban population grew by 0.43 million, reaching 11.38 million, while the majority (30.86 million) continues to reside in the rural areas.

(ii). Vital Statistics and Life Expectancy

The birth rate slightly decreased from 30.31 to 29.68 per 1,000 population in 2023 while the death rate also showed a decline. The fertility rate dropped from 3.99 to 3.85 births per woman. Life expectancy at birth slightly improved from 65.63 years in 2022 to 65.97 years in 2023.

Economic Outlook of Afghanistan (2022-2023)

(i) GDP and Economic Growth

Afghanistan's GDP decreased slightly from \$14.18 billion in 2022 to \$13.92 billion in 2023. The country faced a negative growth rate of -6.75% in 2023, compared to -6.24% in the previous year. GDP per capita also declined from \$396 in 2022 to \$361 in 2023.

(ii) Inflation and the Trade Balance

Inflation experienced a significant shift, dropping from 10.6% in 2022 to -7.71% in 2023. The trade balance also improved, with a reduction in the deficit from -\$6.68 billion in 2022 to -\$3.33 billion in 2023.

Overview of Pakistan-Afghanistan Bilateral Trade

This report analyzes Afghanistan's trade with Pakistan as well as Afghanistan's trade with other bordering and non-bordering regional countries. It lists the top product categories, the specific product exports and imports for each trading partner with Afghanistan.

Pakistan and Afghanistan maintain a strong bilateral trade relationship focused mainly on essential goods. Pakistan primarily exports food products, cement, pharmaceuticals, textiles, and manufactured items to Afghanistan. On the other hand, Afghanistan exports fresh and dried fruits, vegetables, and minerals to Pakistan. Over the 2020-2024 period, Pakistan's exports to Afghanistan increased steadily, achieving a Compound Annual Growth Rate (CAGR) of 7.55%, having risen from \$852.31 million in 2020 to \$1,140.17 million in 2024. In contrast, Pakistan's imports from Afghanistan were more variable, peaking at \$880.07 million in 2023 before dropping to \$566.44 million in 2024. Pakistan's imports from Afghanistan have shown a more moderate CAGR of 4.87% over the 2020 -24 period.

2: Trade Relations Between Afghanistan and Pakistan (FY' 2024)

In Financial year 2024, Afghanistan's trade with Pakistan has shown an upward trend with specific high-demand products and dominant sectors in both directions.

- Afghanistan's Exports to Pakistan: The largest export of Afghanistan to Pakistan was cotton, valued at \$120.32 million. Cotton is vital for Pakistan's textile industry, and despite a decrease in imports from Afghanistan in recent years, it remains a major commodity. Onions and shallots ranked second among Afghanistan's exports, with a value of \$72.91 million.
- Pakistan's Exports to Afghanistan: Pakistan's largest export to Afghanistan was rice, with a total value of \$277.51 million. This includes various types of rice such as Basmati (\$81.76 million) and other varieties (\$195.75 million. Another key export is cement, particularly Portland cement used for construction, with exports reaching \$65.92 million.
- Category Analysis: (Exports and Imports by Major Categories) The largest export category from Pakistan to Afghanistan in FY'24 was cereals, totaling \$348.80 million, with rice and maize leading the category. The pharmaceutical products category followed at \$129.89 million, featuring essential medicaments such as vitamins, hormones, and antibiotics. Edible vegetables and certain roots, including potatoes and tomatoes, contributed \$74.73 million to the export value.
- On the import side, Edible Vegetables and Certain Roots is the largest import category for Pakistan in its trade with Afghanistan, and which was valued at \$183.58 million, primarily driven by onions, tomatoes, and chickpeas. Cotton is the second-largest import category at \$120.36 million, while mineral fuels and oils, including coal and LPG, contributed \$120.01 million to imports.

3: Afghanistan's Trade Overview with Other Border Countries

(Iran, Tajikistan, Uzbekistan)

In the second part of this study, we examine Afghanistan's trade, focusing on export and import patterns with border countries other than Pakistan, these include Iran, Tajikistan, and Uzbekistan,

- Afghanistan's Trade with Tajikistan: In 2023, Afghanistan's total exports to Tajikistan were worth \$ 42.22 million. The top Afghan export to Tajikistan was of fresh tropical fruits, such as tamarinds, lychees, and passion fruit, valued at \$1.30 million.
- Afghanistan's total imports from Tajikistan in 2023 were worth \$80.67 million. The primary import from Tajikistan in 2023 was electrical energy, valued at \$57.04 million. Portland cement followed at \$13.99 million, with wheat flour ranked third at \$3.47 million.

- Afghanistan's Trade with Iran: In 2022, Afghanistan's total exports to Iran were worth \$34.17 million. The leading export to Iran was sunflower seeds, valued at \$4.26 million, a significant increase from \$2.58 million in 2021. Unwrought lead followed, with exports worth \$3.35 million, marking a recovery after a lack of recorded exports in 2020 and 2021. On the other side, Afghanistan's total imports from Iran in 2022 were \$1,556.44 million. The largest import from Iran in 2022 was light oils and petroleum, valued at \$281.22 million, followed by medium oils at \$100.67 million.
- Afghanistan's Trade with Uzbekistan: In 2022 Afghanistan's total exports to Uzbekistan were worth \$11.30 million. Cotton was Afghanistan's leading export to Uzbekistan, valued at \$1.72 million, growing from \$1.12 million in 2021. Fresh or dried almonds followed with \$1.07 million in exports, showing a significant increase from just \$0.07 million in 2021. Afghanistan's total imports from Uzbekistan in 2022 were worth \$541.21 million. The primary import from Uzbekistan was wheat or meslin flour, totaling \$268.53 million, slightly lower than \$281.01 million in 2021.

Afghanistan's Category Wise Trade with Border Countries excluding Pakistan

- Afghanistan's trade with its border countries excluding Pakistan shows significant sectoral diversity. In 2023, edible fruits and nuts were Afghanistan's top export to Tajikistan, valued at \$1.64 million, mainly comprising tamarinds and jackfruit, while the largest import from Tajikistan was mineral fuels and oils at \$60.39 million, primarily electrical energy, followed by salt, sulfur, earths, and stone (mainly cement) at \$14.00 million.
- In trade with Iran, Afghanistan's primary export in 2022 was oil seeds and oleaginous fruits worth \$11.72 million, followed by coffee, tea, maté, and spices at \$3.81 million. Imports from Iran were led by mineral fuels and oils, totaling \$556.88 million, with plastics and articles thereof as the second-largest import at \$162.28 million.
- In trade with Uzbekistan, Afghanistan's leading export category was edible fruits and nuts at \$2.05 million, featuring almonds and dried apricots, followed by cotton exports valued at \$1.98 million, which was primarily uncarded cotton. Afghanistan's top import category from Uzbekistan was products of the milling industry, mostly wheat or meslin flour, valued at \$268.80 million, followed by mineral fuels and oils totaling \$150.25 million, including electrical energy.

4: Trade Relations with Non-Border Regional Countries

(China, Kazakhstan, India, Turkey, UAE)

This section looks at Afghanistan's trade relations with key non-border regional countries.

- Afghanistan's Trade with China: In 2023, Afghanistan's total exports to China were worth \$64.00 million. In 2023, fresh or dried pine nuts were Afghanistan's leading export to China, valued at \$57.24 million, a substantial increase from \$34.22 million in 2022. On the import side, Afghanistan's total imports from China were worth \$1,269.78 million. Afghanistan's primary import from China was commodities not elsewhere specified, amounting to \$306.45 million in 2023, a huge rise from \$2.00 million in 2022.
- Afghanistan's Trade with Kazakhstan: In 2023, Afghanistan's total exports to Kazakhstan were worth \$31.15 million. The leading export to Kazakhstan was waters, including mineral and aerated, valued at \$14.48 million, a significant increase from \$3.06 million in 2022 and \$0.79 million in 2021. Afghanistan's total imports from Kazakhstan in 2023 were worth \$615.51 million. The major imports from Kazakhstan were wheat or meslin flour, which totaled \$368.02 million in 2023, though this marked a decrease from \$554.40 million in 2022.
- Afghanistan's Trade with India: In 2023, Afghanistan's total exports to India were worth \$666.15 million. The top exports to India were led by lac, natural gums, and resins (\$155.76 million), followed by fresh or dried figs (\$149.50 million) & dried grapes (\$82.17 million). In 2023 Afghanistan's total imports from India were worth \$362.34 million. The main imports from India in 2023 were pharmaceutical products (\$88.15 million), articles of apparel and clothing accessories (\$44.08 million) and man-made staple fibers (\$30.58 million).
- Afghanistan's Trade with Turkey: In 2023, Afghanistan's total exports to Turkey were worth \$31.15 million. Afghanistan's top exports to Turkey were led by dried apricots (\$7.49 million). In 2023, Afghanistan's total imports

- from Turkey were worth \$256.41 million. Imports were led by sunflower-seed or safflower oil and their fractions (\$19.93 million).
- Afghanistan's Trade with the UAE: In 2022, Afghanistan's total exports to the United Arab Emirates (UAE) were worth \$9.48Est million. The leading exports were gold, valued at \$9.10 million, despite significant declines from previous years (\$418.94 million in 2021 and \$540.32 million in 2020). On other side, Afghanistan's total imports form the UAE were worth \$1,254.38^{Est}. million. The top imports from the UAE in 2022 were led by cigarettes containing tobacco, worth \$347.01 million.

Afghanistan's Category Wise Trade with Non-Border Regional Countries

- Afghanistan's trade with non-border regional countries in 2023 displayed diverse sectoral engagement. Exports to China were led by edible fruits and nuts, reaching \$60.72 million, primarily pine nuts (\$57.24 million) and dried apricots (\$3.32 million), while commodities not elsewhere specified represented Afghanistan's top import from China at \$306.45 million, significantly up from \$2 million in 2022.
- Exports to Kazakhstan featured beverages, spirits, and vinegar as the leading category, with \$16.35 million in exports, mainly comprising flavored waters (\$14.48 million). Afghanistan's largest import category from Kazakhstan was products of the milling industry, totaling \$368.46 million, primarily wheat or meslin flour (\$368.02 million).
- In its trade with India, Afghanistan's primary exports included edible fruits and nuts (\$366.20 million), lac, gums, and resins (\$155.76 million), and coffee, tea, maté, and spices (\$63.01 million). Afghanistan's imports from India featured pharmaceutical products (\$88.15 million) and apparel (\$44.08 million).
- Exports to Turkey were also strong in edible fruits and nuts (\$13.55 million), oil seeds and oleaginous fruits (\$4.96 million), and raw hides and skins (\$4.23 million), while imports were focused on electrical machinery and equipment (\$31.44 million) and machinery and mechanical appliances (\$22.96 million).
- Trade with the United Arab Emirates featured Afghanistan's exports of edible fruits and nuts (\$13.83 million), including dried grapes, almonds, and figs. Imports from the UAE were largely in tobacco and manufactured tobacco products, reaching \$360.27 million.

5: Common Products Imported by Afghanistan for Multiple Trading Partners

This section examines opportunities for Pakistan to expand its exports to Afghanistan by analyzing goods produced domestically but not being exported in significant volumes to Afghanistan. We compare Pakistan's production capabilities with exports from both border countries (Tajikistan, Iran, Uzbekistan) and non-border regional countries (China, India, Kazakhstan, Turkey, and UAE) to identify overlapping product categories. A detailed review of Afghanistan's top 50 imported products highlights potential areas for Pakistan to replace imports from other sources.

- In 2023, Afghanistan's top five imports included wheat or meslin flour at \$381.72 million, primarily from Kazakhstan (\$368.02 million) with smaller contributions from Pakistan. Palm oil ranked second at \$330.17 million, with limited imports from Pakistan.
- Commodities not elsewhere specified were third at \$312.59 million, largely from China (\$306.45 million), while Pakistan's contribution was minimal at \$0.004 million.
- Imports of food preparations totaled \$126.97 million, with Pakistan contributing \$84.90 million. Medicaments amounted to \$117.06 million, with Pakistan supplying \$55.69 million.

6: Input from Relevant Stakeholders

- After interviewing various stakeholders and traders, it is evident that Pakistan has substantial opportunities to expand its exports to Afghanistan and to the Central Asian countries, leveraging the transit trade route through Afghanistan.
- In the Central Asian Republics, as per respondents, products in high demand include mango juice, meat, cereals, and pharmaceutical items which present significant potential for growth. Strengthening trade agreements, improving transport infrastructure, and streamlining customs and payment procedures can help unlock these markets.
- Pakistan and Afghanistan share a vital trade relationship, but several challenges hinder the full potential of this
 economic partnership. Key issues include the 2% Infrastructure Development (IDC) imposed by the KP government
 on Pakistani exporters, which raises export costs and reduces competitiveness.

- Limited formal banking channels due to international sanctions imposed on the Afghan government is leading to reliance on informal systems like hawala thereby increasing both financial costs and risks.
- Respondents suggested formalizing payment channels and enhancing financial transparency through digital platforms and direct banking agreements which can address payment-related concerns. By implementing these measures, the respondents were confident that Pakistan can enhance its exports, strengthen trade ties with Afghanistan, and gain greater access to Central Asian markets.
- Moreover, exporters face logistical difficulties due to poor infrastructure, complex customs procedures, and security concerns along trade routes, further complicating cross-border trade. They also complained that the trucking industry was dominated by small informal operators which mostly operate as a cartel.

6.1 Issues in Bilateral Trade between Pakistan and Afghanistan

i. Common Issue Identified by Traders

Valuation of Imports from Afghanistan: Though a number of items were identified by traders as being prone to valuation disputes between importers and Customs in Pakistan, the case of hand-made carpets was flagged as an important example. Exports from Pakistan of hand-made carpets have significantly decreased in recent months. Most carpet exports from Pakistan are of hand knotted carpets made either by Afghans residing in Pakistan or these carpets are imported in semi-finished form from Afghanistan. The recent action against Afghans residing in Pakistan has led to Afghan weavers in Pakistan also returning to Afghanistan, carpet exports thus are mostly dependent on imports of semi-finished carpets from Afghanistan. Currently the major issue pointed out by carpet exporters is the valuation rates for semi-finished carpets and unnecessary harassment at the border.

ii. Other Issues in Bilateral Trade Issues

- Geographical Advantage Not Utilized: Bilateral trade between Pakistan and Afghanistan was once higher, with Pakistan exporting 80 percent and importing 20 percent. Pakistan has the capacity to supply everything from high value goods to common necessities. However, Pakistan has not fully capitalized on this opportunity. In 2012, Pakistan's exports to Afghanistan reached around 1.5 billion dollars, but they have declined since then.
- Frequent Border Closures: Despite being neighbors and having a history of conflict, Pakistan has never stopped trading with India, even during times of war. However, frequent closures of the Pakistan-Afghanistan border, affecting both pedestrian movement and trade, have majorly disrupted businesses. Since the border is the only trade route, any closure directly impacts trade.
- Decades old Ties between Traders on both sides of the border are weakening: In the private sector, businesses rely on mutual trust to place orders and deliver goods, in some cases these ties go back generations. When trade is frequently disrupted, as has happened in Pakistan-Afghanistan bilateral trade; this has led to major losses to traders on both sides of the border. These disruptions lead to weakening in trade ties. This is especially true when it comes to perishable commodities. Traders on both sides of the border who deal in perishable commodities are increasingly looking towards other buyers and suppliers,

iii. Lack of formal payment channels are a major hinderance:

Currently there is no formal mechanism for settling export and import payments between the central banks in both countries. This increases the risk in trade as there is a lot of physical movement of cash at the border. This also encourages the use of illegal payment channels leading to a loss of foreign exchange for the country.

iv. Logistics Problems at the Border

Lack of Infrastructure at the border: The infrastructure at the border between Pakistan and Afghanistan has become a significant bottleneck for trade, particularly for perishable goods. The lack of space for additional containers results in prolonged delays, causing substantial losses to traders dealing in fresh fruits, vegetables, and other time-sensitive products. Inadequate storage and clearance facilities further exacerbate the problem, leading to spoilage and increased costs for exporters and importers. Since Torkham serves as a crucial trade route, these inefficiencies hinder the smooth flow of goods, negatively impacting bilateral trade.

v. Delays at the border:

Multi-Agency Clearance Delays: At the Torkham border, it is not just Customs that regulate trade; multiple agencies are involved. Even after clearing customs and completing all formalities, security agencies conduct additional checks, causing delays and negatively impacting trade efficiency.

vi. Political and Bureaucratic Inefficiencies

Political Tensions Disrupt Trade: The eruption of frequent political disputes between Pakistan and Afghanistan further complicates trade relations. For instance, during the grape season, Pakistan increased tariffs by 15%, leading to significant losses for Afghan farmers as their products went to waste. In retaliation, Afghanistan raised tariffs on Pakistani products. These ongoing political tit-for-tat continue to harm traders, producers, and farmers on both sides. Improving political relations, Customs system, and law and order would not only enhance bilateral trade but also open access to Central Asian markets, reducing Pakistan's dependence on other countries for exports.

vii. Perishable Exports

- Trade Barriers & Delays: Police interference, border delays, and arbitrary closures result in perishable goods being wasted, causing financial losses. The export of fresh meat to Afghanistan, requires ensuring timely delivery. However, local delays, police interference for speed money, and border holdups negatively impact trade.
- Policy Disruptions: In one particular case, a court case led to an order halting meat export to Afghanistan after a judge was misinformed that exports were causing local price hikes. The ban lasted for three months, financially ruining many traders. Later, a food secretary admitted the mistake and allowed exports to resume, but by then, the exporters had lost a lucrative trade channel as Afghan importers had started sourcing meat from other countries.

viii. Trade Policy Inconsistency:

When the tomato export season started. Pakistan did not allow the export of tomatoes, which led to significant financial losses for small businessmen. In some cases, tomatoes were even discarded from the mountains of Torkham due to the inability to export them to Afghanistan. These losses were a direct result of the Pakistani government's decision to halt tomato exports at the border. This restriction prevented traders from delivering their products to Afghanistan. If such issues continue to disrupt trade between Pakistan & Afghanistan, it will become increasingly difficult for Pakistan to maintain trade relations with Afghanistan. Meanwhile, other neighboring and non-neighboring countries will find it easier to access the Afghan market.

7. Policy Recommendations

1. Reduction & Rationalization of Infrastructure Development CESS (IDC)

- The high value of the Infrastructure Development CESS (IDC) imposed by the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (KP) government increases costs for exporters, making Pakistani products less competitive. This IDC is levied on the value of the consignment and becomes a significant number for value added products. The KP government should consider reducing or rationalizing the IDC to align with regional trade policies and ensure Pakistani goods remain price-competitive in Afghanistan and Central Asia.
- A structured dialogue between exporters and government authorities is needed to assess the impact of IDC and explore alternative revenue-generation mechanisms that do not burden exporters.

2. Enhancing Formal Banking and Payment Channels

- The lack of formal banking channels forces traders to rely on informal systems like Hawala, which increases financial risks and costs. Pakistan & Afghanistan need to work on establishing direct payment channels.
- Digital payment platforms can be explored to enhance transparency, reduce financial irregularities, and ensure secure transactions. The State Bank of Pakistan (SBP) should consider alternate methods to facilitate cross-border financial transactions through formal mechanisms such as bilateral currency exchange agreements and trade financing options.

3. Revitalizing the Handmade Carpet Industry

- The government can provide incentives to Afghan carpet weavers to stay and work in Pakistan, these can include work permits, business facilitation services, and improved living conditions, to prevent further migration of skilled artisans.
- A special economic zone (SEZ) for carpet manufacturing can be established, offering tax benefits, low-cost production
 facilities, and export subsidies to revive Pakistan's handmade carpet exports and compete with Turkey in the global
 market.

4. Establishing a Trade Credit Guarantee Scheme

- To restore confidence among Afghan traders and prevent them from shifting to other markets, Pakistan should consider introducing a Trade Credit Guarantee Scheme. This scheme would provide financial security for Pakistani traders by ensuring compensation for losses incurred due to trade disruptions, such as border closures or policy shifts.
- Through this "Trade Credit Guarantee Scheme", Pakistani banks, in collaboration with government institutions, can offer credit insurance and risk mitigation measures, allowing Pakistani traders to conduct business without fear of financial loss. Additionally, formalizing mutual credit agreements through regulated banking channels will reduce reliance on informal systems, strengthening Pakistan's trade ties with Afghanistan.

5. Infrastructure Development at Border Crossings

- The Torkham border and other trade routes suffer from congestion, delays, and poor logistics, particularly due to a lack of storage space for perishable goods. Immediate investments are required in cold storage facilities, container handling terminals, and dedicated trade terminals as opposed to the current hybrid system of using the border for both trade and visitors to improve efficiency.
- Public-private partnerships (PPPs) should be encouraged to develop modern border infrastructure, ensuring faster clearance and reducing wastage of agricultural and food imports and exports.

6. Simplification of Customs Procedures and Trade Facilitation

- Complex and time-consuming customs clearance procedures significantly delay shipments. Digitization of customs
 processes, pre-clearance mechanisms, should be implemented to streamline documentation and reduce clearance
 times
- Joint border management initiatives between Pakistan and Afghanistan should be developed to improve coordination between Customs authorities, reducing unnecessary inspections and delays.

7. Strengthening Trade Agreements and Market Access

- Pakistan should negotiate preferential trade agreements (PTAs) or Free Trade Agreements (FTAs) with Afghanistan
 and Central Asian countries to enhance market access for high-demand products such as mango juice, meat, cereals,
 and pharmaceuticals.
- Trade delegations and business-to-business (B2B) matchmaking events should be conducted to promote Pakistani
 exports and establish long-term commercial partnerships with Afghanistan and countries in Central Asia.

Objective of the Study

The objective of this study is to conduct an analysis of Afghanistan's trade, with special emphasis on Afghanistan's trade with its neighbors including Pakistan. Afghanistan shares extensive trade relationships not just with border countries such as Pakistan, Iran, Tajikistan, Uzbekistan but countries in the wider region such as China, India, Kazakhstan, Turkey and the UAE. The core objective of this study is to identify products that Pakistan produces but has been unable to export to Afghanistan in significant quantities. Similarly, the Study aims to identify Afghan exports to regional countries with the aim of boosting bilateral Pakistan Afghanistan trade as well as regional trade.

Limitation of Data for the Study

This study explores Afghanistan's trade relations with Pakistan and with both its other bordering and non-bordering regional countries. The study focuses on other border nations Tajikistan, Iran, Uzbekistan, and Turkmenistan, as well as on top five regional countries i.e., China, Kazakhstan, India, Turkey, and the United Arab Emirates (UAE). However, there are key data limitations that affect the scope and accuracy of our analysis. Although Turkmenistan is one of Afghanistan's bordering countries, reliable trade data for Turkmenistan from 2019 to 2023 is not available, and therefore, it has been excluded from this study.

In our analysis, data inconsistencies between reporting sources have also been addressed through selective base-year adjustments. Specifically, FY '2024 data for Pakistan's trade with Afghanistan has been taken from the Pakistan Bureau of Statistics (PBS) to provide the most recent and relevant information. In contrast, data for Tajikistan, China, Kazakhstan, India, and Turkey is based on 2023 calendar year figures sourced from the International Trade Center (ITC). Furthermore, since 2023 trade data for Iran, Uzbekistan, and the UAE is unavailable on the ITC website, we have used data for the 2019 to 2022 period to estimate trade in 2023, this has been done to maintain consistency and comparability in the analysis.

Another significant limitation is the absence of Afghanistan's reported trade data on the ITC platform, this restricts our ability to fully assess Afghanistan's reported export and import numbers. For the purpose of this report, we have used "mirror data" which is trade data that has been reported by Afghanistan's bilateral trade partners. Despite these limitations, the selected base years and the reliance on mirror data, this report provides a structured approach to understanding the trade dynamics between Afghanistan and its regional trading partners.

Overview of Afghanistan

1.1 Cultural Background

The Islamic Republic of Afghanistan / The Islamic Emirate of Afghanistan (Afghanistan) is a culturally rich and diverse nation where religion plays a central role in daily life. The majority of Afghans are Muslims, with Sunni Islam being the dominant sect, along with a significant Shia Muslim minority. The country is home to two official languages: Dari, a Persian dialect widely spoken in urban areas and used in government, and Pashto, predominantly spoken in the south and east. In addition to these, ethnic minorities contribute to the linguistic diversity with languages like Uzbek, Turkmen, and Balochi. Afghanistan's population is made up of various ethnic groups, including Pashtuns, Tajiks, Hazaras, and Uzbeks.

1.2 History

Afghanistan's history dates back to around 7000 B.C., with the region undergoing numerous transitions over the centuries. In 330 B.C., Alexander the Great conquered Afghanistan, introducing Greek culture and language. Later, in the 13th century, the Mongols under Genghis Khan invaded the region. In 1747, Pashtun leaders convened a council known as a Loya Jirga, which marked the establishment of the Afghan kingdom (National Geographic, 2024).

During the 19th and 20th centuries, Afghanistan clashed with the British in three wars, ultimately achieving victory in 1919. This led to the formation of an independent monarchy in 1921. In 1978, the People's Democratic Party of Afghanistan (PDPA) came to power, triggering a series of events that transformed the country from a largely peaceful state into a hub for conflict and terrorism. The PDPA's rule led to a civil war, as Afghan fighters, known as the mujahedin, rebelled against the government. Soviet forces invaded Afghanistan in 1979, remaining until their withdrawal in 1989. Civil unrest persisted, culminating in the collapse of the PDPA regime in 1992 (National Geographic, 2024).

In 2001, after the September 11 terrorist attacks in the United States, the U.S. and its allies launched military operations in Afghanistan, resulting in the overthrow of the Taliban regime in December 2001 (National Geographic, 2024).

In August 2021, the US forces withdrew from Afghanistan leading to Afghanistan once again being governed by the Taliban

1.3 Economic Activity After the Taliban Takeover

Afghanistan faces severe economic challenges, worsened by an influx of returning refugees—over 600,000 from Pakistan since late 2023 and similar numbers from Iran—adding to this number is the unemployment of half a million former opium field laborers after the Taliban's narcotics ban. Women's employment has declined by 25% since the Taliban takeover due to restrictions on their work and movement. While the Taliban have stabilized some economic indicators like exports and the value of the currency, deflation, frozen central bank assets, and declining foreign aid hinder growth, with the World Bank projecting zero growth in the coming years.

Public services, particularly health, water, and sanitation, have deteriorated due to funding shortages, sanctions, and restrictions on women workers. Preventable illnesses have risen, water access has dropped significantly, and bureaucratic delays affect essential documents.

Afghanistan is situated in Central Asia, bordered by Iran to the west and Pakistan to the east. The country's landscape is dominated by towering mountains and arid deserts. The rugged mountain peaks are snow-covered for much of the year, making them difficult to traverse.

A significant number of Afghans reside in the fertile valleys nestled between the mountains, where they cultivate crops and rear livestock. However, only about 20 percent of Afghanistan's land is suitable for farming.

Summers in the region are typically hot and dry, while winters are extremely cold, particularly in areas north of the Hindu Kush, a prominent mountain range in the eastern part of the country near Pakistan and Tajikistan.

Afghanistan's mountain passes have historically served as critical pathways for travelers crossing Asia. The country was a vital part of the Silk Road, an ancient trade route that connected China, Central Asia, India, and Europe, facilitating commerce and cultural exchanges for over 2000 years (National Geographic, 2024).

1.4 Demographic Outlook of Afghanistan

The demographic indicators presented in the table below offer an overview of Afghanistan's population trends between 2022 and 2023. Key observations include:

Afghanistan's population increased from 41.13 million in 2022 to 42.24 million in 2023, reflecting a population growth rate of 2.67% in 2023, up from 2.53% in the previous year, while both urban and rural populations grew, urban population increased by 0.43 million to 11.38 million, indicating a shift towards urbanization. However, majority of the population (30.86 million) resides in rural areas.

The population density rose slightly from 63.00 people per km² in 2022 to 64.70 people per km² in 2023. The birth rate declined marginally from 30.31 births per 1,000 people in 2022 to 29.68 in 2023. The death rate also saw a small reduction, from 6.02 deaths per 1,000 people to 5.90. Further the fertility rate declined from 3.99 births per woman in 2022 to 3.85 in 2023. Life expectancy at birth also improved slightly, rising from 65.63 years in 2022 to 65.97 years in 2023.



Figure 1-2 shows the population of Afghanistan from 2014 to 2023, where the population has been increasing at an increasing rate. In 2023, the population growth rate was 2.67 leading to an increase in the population from 41.13 million in 2022 to 42.24 million in 2023.

Figure 1-3 shows the population of Afghanistan in 2023. The population pyramid of Afghanistan reveals a youthful demographic structure, with the highest concentration in the 0-4 years age group, where males and females each constitute approximately 15% of their respective populations, indicating a high birth rate. The distribution is relatively balanced between genders across most age groups, but the population percentage declines steadily with age, reflecting high mortality rates and limited life expectancy. The elderly (50+ years) make up the smallest segment.




Figure 1-4: Rural Urban Distribution of Afghanistan between 2014 & 2023

Figure 1-4 shows the rural-urban distribution of the population of Afghanistan between 2014 & 2023. In 2023, the urban population reached 11.38 million, reflecting a steady increase over the years from 8.04 million in 2014. On the other hand, the rural population stood at 30.86 million in 2023, also showing growth from 24.67 million in 2014.

Figure 1-5 shows the net migration for Afghanistan for 2008, 2013, 2018 and 2023. Afghanistan's net migration turned negative in 2018 and 2023 due to a combination of political instability, economic challenges, and security concerns. In 2018, ongoing conflict and poverty drove people to leave the country, seeking better opportunities or safety in neighboring countries like Iran and Pakistan.

In the recent past, Afghanistan has faced over 40 years of challenges, including war, natural disasters, poverty, hunger, and the COVID-19 pandemic. Nearly 10.9 million Afghans are displaced, most of them staying within Afghanistan or in nearby countries due to conflict, poverty, and violence (UNHCR, 2024).

1.5 Economic outlook

The key economic indicators for Afghanistan in 2022 and 2023 are summarized in Table 1-2. The GDP declined slightly from \$14.18 billion in 2022 to \$13.92 billion in 2023, with the negative GDP growth rate worsening from -6.24% to -6.75%. Afghanistan's GDP per capita also fell from \$396 in 2022 to \$361 in 2023. Inflation showed a significant shift, dropping from 10.6% in 2022 to -7.71% in 2023.

Figure 1-6 shows the sectoral contribution to the GDP of Afghanistan for the year 2022. The Services sector emerged as the largest contributor, accounting for 54.7% of GDP. Agriculture followed with a significant share of 30.2%. Industry contributed 15.1%. Within the services sector "Others" category, at 39.4% remained unspecified, but notable subcategories included Transport, Storage, and Communications at 8.2% and Wholesale, Retail Trade, Restaurants, and Hotels at 7.1%.

Figure 1-7 shows the GDP and GDP per capita of Afghanistan from 2014 to 2023. Afghanistan's economy experienced a significant contraction between 2018 and 2023, as reflected in both GDP and GDP per capita. GDP peaked at 19.98 billion US\$ in 2020 before steadily declining to 15.16 billion US\$ in 2021, 14.18 billion US\$ in 2022, and 13.92 billion US\$ in 2023. Disruption and uncertainty caused a huge loss of confidence in investing, and many skilled Afghans left the country. After the economy shrank by 20.7% in 2021, it declined by another 6.2% in 2022 (World Bank, 2024). Similarly, GDP per capita showed a peak of 582 US\$ in 2019, but this dropped to 361 US\$ in 2023.

Figure 1-8 shows the Inflation Rate for Afghanistan from 2014 to 2023. Over the years, Afghanistan's inflation trends have fluctuated significantly. Starting at 4.67% in 2014, the economy slipped into deflation in 2015 at -0.66%, signaling reduced consumer demand and economic contraction. A gradual recovery followed, with inflation peaking at 4.98% in 2017 before stabilizing at 0.63% in 2018. From 2019 to 2021, inflation rose steadily from 2.30% to 7.76%, driven by increasing demand pressures and global uncertainties. However, the Taliban's takeover in 2021 marked a turning point, causing widespread instability, governance disruptions, and international sanctions. These events exacerbated inflation, pushing it to 10.60% in 2022, driven by supply chain disruptions, reduced foreign aid, and rising global commodity prices. By 2023, the economy experienced a dramatic deflation of -7.71%, likely due to collapsing domestic demand and tighter economic controls under the Taliban.

Figure 1-9 shows Afghanistan's Real Interest Rate (%) from 2014 to 2023. The real interest rate reflects the lending rate adjusted for inflation, measured by the GDP deflator. A negative real interest rate indicates a decrease in the purchasing power of the borrowed amount. From 2014 to 2019, the rate remained positive but became negative in 2019 and 2020 before turning positive again in 2022 and 2023. The real interest rate plays a key role in economic theories, helping to explain phenomena such as capital flight, business cycles, and economic bubbles. When the real interest rate is high, credit demand increases, encouraging money to shift from consumption to savings. On the other hand, a low real interest rate drives demand toward investment and consumption rather than savings (World Bank, 2024).

Figure 1-10 shows the FDI Net Inflows into Afghanistan from 2014 to 2021. The highest amount of FDI Net Inflows occurred in 2015, reaching 169.15 million US\$. This was followed by a notable inflow of 119.44 million US\$ in 2018. However, in other years, the inflows were significantly lower, with a sharp decline in 2020 and 2021, when the values dropped to 12.97 million US\$ and 20.60 million US\$, respectively.

Figure 1-11 shows Afghanistan's unemployment rate from 2014 to 2023. Over the decade, unemployment has generally increased, rising from 7.92% in 2014 to 14.39% in 2023.

From 2014 to 2017, the unemployment rate increased gradually, reaching 11.18% in 2017. A slight stabilization occurred between 2017 and 2020, with rates fluctuating between 10.1% in 2016 and 11.71% in 2020. However, it began rising in 2021, reaching 11.93%, and this continued through 2022 and 2023, when unemployment hit its highest level at 14.39%.

1.6 Global Rankings

Table 1-3 shows Afghanistan's Global Indicators score and rankings. Afghanistan's score is poor in the INFORM Risk Index and Political Stability.



Afghanistan's score of **8.1** indicates a high level of **Inform Risk Index**, particularly from disasters and conflicts. This is considerably higher than the South Asian average of 4.7 and the Low-Income countries' score of **6.75**.

Afghanistan Ranked **6th** out of 179 economies in **Fragile States Index (2023)**, Afghanistan is categorized as a highly fragile state. This ranking reflects severe challenges in areas such as security, human rights, economic stability, and governance. In comparison, the South Asia region has a much better average ranking of **48**, while Low-Income countries score **20.5**.

Afghanistan ranks **152** out of 180 in **Press Freedom Index (2023)**, indicating limited freedom of the press. Although it performs marginally lower than the South Asia average of 142.5, it is significantly worse than the Low-Income average of 113.5. Restrictions on media, threats to journalists, and censorship are common challenges in Afghanistan.

Afghanistan scores **31.88** out of 100 in **Women**, **Business & Law Index (2022)**, indicating significant legal and regulatory barriers for women in business and employment. This is far below the South Asia average of 69.68 and the Low-Income score of 69.38. The low score reflects inadequate legal protections for women, limiting their economic participation and ability to thrive in business.



Chapter: 2

Pakistan, Afghanistan Bilateral Trade

2.1 Pakistan, Afghanistan Bilateral Trade an Overview⁷

Pakistan and Afghanistan have maintained a significant trade relationship over the years. Pakistan primarily exports food products, cement, pharmaceuticals, textiles, and manufactured goods to Afghanistan. On the other hand, Afghanistan exports fresh and dried fruits, vegetables, and minerals to Pakistan. The table and the figure below, show the export and import trends between Pakistan and Afghanistan from financial year July 2020 to Jun 2024.

Pakistan's exports to Afghanistan have demonstrated a strong upward trend over the five-year period, from 2020 to 2024, with a Compound Annual Growth Rate (CAGR) of 7.55%. In 2020, Pakistan exported goods worth \$852.31 million, which steadily increased to \$1,140.17 million in 2024. The highest export value was recorded in 2024, while the lowest was in 2022, when exports fell to \$805.14 million. After this decline in 2022, exports have recovered and have been growing.

Pakistan's imports from Afghanistan, on the other hand, have seen more fluctuations. Imports rose from \$468.34 million in 2020 to a peak of \$880.07 million in 2023. However, in 2024, imports decreased sharply to \$566.44 million. Despite this volatility, the overall import trend showed moderate growth, with a CAGR of 4.87% over the 5-year period.



2.2 Pakistan Product and Category-Wise Trade with Afghanistan

In this section, we explore Pakistan's product and category-wise trade with Afghanistan, focusing on the key exports and imports between the two countries. This trade analysis is based on FY'2024⁸ data, thus providing an updated and relevant overview of bilateral trade relations. Pakistan primarily exports agricultural goods, pharmaceuticals, and essential food items to Afghanistan. These exports include cereals such as basmati rice, other rice varieties, and broken rice, as well as pharmaceutical products containing vitamins, hormone antibiotics, and other therapeutic compounds. Additionally, Pakistan exports edible vegetables and roots, including fresh or chilled potatoes, tomatoes, and edible brassicas.

On the other hand, Pakistan imports agricultural products and raw materials from Afghanistan. Key imports include edible vegetables like onions, tomatoes, and dry green beans, along with raw cotton. Moreover, Pakistan sources a variety of edible fruits and nuts from Afghanistan, including fresh grapes, pomegranates, dried grapes, fresh apples, and dried apricots.

The tables below show export and import trade between Pakistan and Afghanistan in more detail. Tables use 2024 as the base year. The tables highlight the top exports from Pakistan to Afghanistan and the top imports from Afghanistan into Pakistan, providing a comprehensive overview of their trade patterns and the product categories traded.

As shown in the table above, Pakistan's exports to Afghanistan are primarily dominated by rice, along with other pharmaceuticals, cement, and fresh fruits. Rice dominates the list, with other varieties of rice valued at \$195.75 million and Basmati rice at \$81.76 million, reflecting the significant demand for rice in Afghanistan. Further, other Portland cement, used for construction, is ranked third with \$65.92 million in exports. Broken rice follows closely in 4th place at \$64.35 million.

Pharmaceutical exports, such as medicaments containing vitamins, also showed strong performance, with exports reaching \$61.29 million in 2024. Other important food products other than rice, include food preparations and fresh potatoes, valued at \$56.96 million and \$50.86 million, respectively. Cans (≤400ML with logo/brand), used for packaging, contributed \$37.35 million, reflecting the growing demand for packaging materials, likely due to the increase in food processing in Afghanistan.

Fresh fruits like Kino and bananas also made a significant contribution to exports in 2024, with values reaching \$29.50 million and \$11.07 million respectively. Other notable exports include motorcycle CLY 50-250cc, meat, vegetable fat, and poly bottle grade materials.

Table 2.3 shows Pakistan's top 25 imports from Afghanistan, among imports, cotton stands out as the largest commodity, valued at \$120.32 million in FY-24.

Although cotton imports from Afghanistan were as high as \$194.61 million in FY-22, they have declined in FY-24.

Onions and shallots rank second among top imports, with imports valued at \$72.91 million in FY-24, another significant import is coal (other coal, not agglomerated), which totaled \$66.90 million in FY-24. This figure marks a decrease from \$141.01 million in FY-23, probably due to a reduction in global prices of coal.

Fresh fruits like **grapes** and **pomegranates** also have notable import values, with grapes valued at \$53.24 million and pomegranates at \$19.01 million in FY-24. The import of bituminous coal at \$47.63 million shows Afghanistan's importance as a supplier of energy resources to Pakistan.

Tomatoes saw an increase in imports, reaching \$44.33 million in FY-24 compared to \$30.29 million in FY-23. Similarly, **kidney beans** imports were worth \$9.88 million, products like green beans and cucumbers also contributed significantly to Pakistan's food imports.

Other notable imports include seeds (cumin), other chickpeas, and dried fruits such as apricots and grapes.

2.3 Pakistan Category-Wise Trade with Afghanistan

Pakistan exports a diverse range of products to Afghanistan, with five major categories leading in FY-24. **Cereals** form the largest export category, valued at \$348.80 million, including key products like rice (in various forms such as Basmati, broken, and other varieties) and maize.


The second most significant export category is **Pharmaceutical Products**, totaling \$129.89 million, comprising medicaments with vitamins, hormones, and antibiotics. Another vital export is **Edible Vegetables and Certain Roots**, amounting to \$74.73 million, primarily featuring potatoes, tomatoes, and other vegetables.

Salt, Sulphur, Earths, and Stone- which includes cement and rock salt-contributed \$73.58 million. The fifth major export category is **Miscellaneous Edible Preparations**, with Pakistan exporting \$67.20 million worth of products to Afghanistan, including various food preparations, flavoring powders, and protein concentrates.

Pakistan's largest import category from Afghanistan is **Edible Vegetables and Certain Roots**, valued at \$183.58 million. This includes onions, tomatoes, and chickpeas.

Cotton imports rank second, with a value of \$120.36 million. **Mineral Fuels and Oils,** including coal and liquefied petroleum gas (LPG), accounted for another \$120.01 million.

Afghanistan is also a key supplier of **Edible Fruits and Nuts**, valued at \$104.37 million, particularly grapes, pomegranates, and apples. The fifth major import sector is **Coffee**, **Tea**, **Maté**, **and Spices**, valued at \$9.75 million, including cumin, coriander, and red chilies.



Chapter: 3

Afghanistan's Global Trade

3.1 Afghanistan's Global Trade Overview

In this Chapter, we review Afghanistan's global trade, focusing on the overall patterns of exports and imports. We will see how much Afghanistan trades with the world, with special emphasis on trade with its bordering countries, as well as its trade with countries which are part of its wider region.



The figure above shows Afghanistan's exports and imports to the world from 2019 to 2023, measured in billions of dollars. The figure highlights the significant trade imbalance between the country's imports and exports during this period.

Afghanistan's exports have shown gradual growth between 2019 and 2023, although they remain relatively low compared to its imports. In 2019, the country's exports stood at \$0.86 billion, and by 2023, they had increased to \$1.60 billion. The highest export value was recorded in 2021, reaching \$1.99 billion, though this was followed by a sudden drop in 2022.

Afghanistan's imports have consistently surpassed exports, reflecting a high dependence on imports to meet domestic needs. In 2019, imports were valued at \$6.78 billion, peaking in 2020 at \$8.73 billion, which was the highest during the review period. Although imports saw a slight decline after 2020, they remained significant, being \$7.56 billion in 2022 and \$4.33 billion in 2023.

3.2 Afghanistan Trade with Bordering Countries

In this section, we will explore Afghanistan's trade relations with its **bordering countries**, specifically focusing on Pakistan, Tajikistan, Iran, Uzbekistan and Turkmenistan. Out of the five neighboring countries, we are presenting data for only four, as reliable trade data for Turkmenistan from 2019 to 2023 is not available. We have chosen 2023 as the base year for Pakistan and Tajikistan, while using 2023 estimated value as the base year for Iran and Uzbekistan, as 2023 trade data for these two countries is not available. This approach allows us to have a comprehensive overview of Afghanistan's trade with its key neighboring countries.

3.3 Afghanistan's Trade Patterns with Bordering Countries

In this part of the report, we will explore Afghanistan's total trade with its bordering countries, including Pakistan, Tajikistan, Iran, and Uzbekistan. This section focuses exclusively on Afghanistan's exports and imports with these neighboring nations, highlighting key products and trade volumes. Additionally, we will analyze the Compound Annual Growth Rate (CAGR) of Afghanistan's trade with its bordering countries, offering insights into the dynamics and trends shaping its regional trade relationships.



The table and figure above provide an overview of Afghanistan's trade with its bordering countries from 2019 to 2023, detailing both exports and imports in billions of dollars. It also includes the compound annual growth rate (CAGR) to highlight the trends over the years.

Afghanistan's exports to bordering countries have shown modest growth, increasing from \$0.59 billion in 2019 to \$0.75 billion in 2023, reflecting a CAGR of 6.02%.

On the other hand, imports from bordering countries have experienced a decline, dropping from \$3.35 billion in 2019 to \$3.15 billion in 2023, with a negative CAGR of -1.50%. This reduction in imports may reflect either a shift towards domestic production, a drop in commodity prices or simply reduced purchasing power in recent years.

3.4 Country-Wise Trade pattern of Afghanistan with Bordering Countries

In this section, we present Afghanistan's total exports and imports with its bordering countries, highlighting the countries with which Afghanistan has the highest levels of exports and imports. The details of this analysis are provided in the following table.

The table provides a comparison of Afghanistan's trade with its bordering countries from 2019 to 2023. Iran emerges as Afghanistan's largest trading partner in 2023 with imports estimated at \$1,556.44 million and exports estimated at \$34.17 million.

3.5 Products and Category-Wise Afghan Trade with Bordering Countries

We now shift our analysis toward Afghanistan's product-specific and category-wise trade with its bordering countries. In this section, we analyze Afghanistan's top products exported and imported in its trade with its neighboring countries. Additionally, we identify the key export and import categories, highlighting the main sectors driving Afghanistan's trade with its bordering countries.

3.5.1 Afghanistan Products and Category-Wise Trade with Pakistan

In this section, we discuss the product and category-wise trade between Pakistan and Afghanistan, highlighting the key commodities exchanged between the two countries. The analysis outlines major export and import categories, identifying trade patterns and shifts over time. A detailed discussion of the data is presented in the tables below, providing insights into value, and composition of bilateral trade across different products and categories.

Afghanistan's top five export products to Pakistan in recent years showcase a mix of agricultural and mineral commodities, reflecting the country's key economic strengths. Leading exports is cotton, which has consistently been Afghanistan's largest export to Pakistan, with a value of \$135.85 million in 2023, though this has seen a decline from the previous year's \$199.24 million. Coal, both non-agglomerated and bituminous, ranks second and third, with combined exports reaching over \$220.01 million in 2023. These figures have seen some fluctuations, particularly with a high of \$239.80 million in coal exports in 2022.

In terms of agricultural exports, fresh grapes and tomatoes are important commodities. Afghanistan exported \$54.52 million worth of fresh grapes to Pakistan in 2023, a slight increase from the previous year, although grape exports have been declining since peaking at \$80.44 million in 2019. Fresh tomatoes followed closely, with exports reaching \$45.82 million in 2023.

Afghanistan's key imports from Pakistan highlight a strong reliance on essential commodities, ranging from food staples to healthcare and construction materials. In 2023, the total value of imports from Pakistan reached \$975.89 million, reflecting a slight decline from the previous year's figure of \$988.92 million, but still showcasing significant trade volumes between the two nations.

In addition to food products, \$84.90 million worth of miscellaneous food preparations were imported in 2023, continuing a trend of increased demand for processed food, which has grown from \$76.31 million in 2022 and \$32.98 million in 2021.

Medicinal products also play a key role in Afghanistan's imports, with medicaments for therapeutic purposes reaching \$55.69 million in 2023.

Finally, construction materials such as Portland cement are another important import, valued at \$55.60 million in 2023. Although slightly lower than in previous years, the demand for cement underscores the ongoing infrastructure development in Afghanistan.

3.5.1.1 Afghanistan Category-Wise Trade with Pakistan

Afghanistan's major export category to Pakistan reflects a diverse mix of mineral resources, agricultural products, and raw materials. The largest export category is **mineral fuels and oils**, with total exports in 2023 reaching \$231.40 million. This sector is dominated by coal, with both non-agglomerated and bituminous coal making up the bulk of these exports, alongside minor exports of liquefied gaseous hydrocarbons.

The second most significant category is **edible vegetables and certain roots and tubers**, valued at \$167.33 million in 2023. Afghanistan's vegetable exports include tomatoes, onions, beans, cucumbers, and chickpeas. **Cotton** ranks third, with exports totaling \$135.87 million in 2023. Afghanistan exports large quantities of unprocessed cotton to Pakistan.

The **edible fruit and nuts** category stands fourth, contributing \$106.69 million to Afghanistan's exports in 2023. Fresh grapes were the leading product, followed by tamarinds, apples, dried apricots, and other dried fruits. Finally, **salt**, **sulphur**, **earths**, **and stones** make up the fifth largest export sector, valued at \$20.36 million in 2023. The major exports in this category include natural steatite and marble.

Afghanistan's major import categories from Pakistan include a diverse range of essential products, predominantly from the cereals, pharmaceutical, food preparations, and construction materials sectors.

The largest import category is **cereals**, with imports valued at \$217.56 million in 2023. This sector is dominated by different types of rice, including broken and semi-milled or wholly milled rice, which form a staple part of Afghanistan's food supply. Maize is also a smaller but notable import within this category.

The second major category is **pharmaceutical products**, with imports totaling \$113.60 million in 2023. Afghanistan relies heavily on Pakistan for medicaments used for therapeutic and prophylactic purposes, including hormone-related medicines and antibiotics. **Miscellaneous edible preparations** rank third, contributing \$88.45 million in imports. This category is led by food preparations, including protein concentrates and other edible mixtures.

Edible vegetables and certain roots and tubers come fourth, with a total import value of \$76.78 million in 2023. Key products include fresh potatoes, cabbages, and tomatoes. Lastly, **salt, sulphur, earths, and stone**, primarily Portland cement and salt, make up the fifth major import sector, valued at \$59.30 million.

3.5.2 Afghanistan's Products and category Wise Trade with Tajikistan

Afghanistan primarily exports agricultural goods, textiles, and raw materials to Tajikistan. These often include agriculture, industrial and manufacture products along with a variety of specific items such as fresh tamarinds, dried grapes, dried apricots, fresh apples, edible vegetables, and wood products, including wood charcoal. Additionally, Afghanistan exports miscellaneous manufactured articles, plastics, and live animals, showcasing a mix of agricultural and manufactured goods.

Conversely, Afghanistan imports a range of industrial products from Tajikistan, including machinery and textiles, as well as mineral fuels, oils, and electrical energy to meet its energy needs. Other key imports include salt, sulfur, products of the milling industry, vehicles (excluding railways), and dairy and poultry products such as birds' eggs, natural honey, and other animal-based edible goods.

The tables below cover the export and import of products between Afghanistan and Tajikistan in more detail. These tables identify the top exports from Afghanistan to Tajikistan and the top imports into Afghanistan from Tajikistan, providing a clearer picture of the trade dynamics and product categories dominating their bilateral trade.

Afghanistan's exports to Tajikistan were led by a mix of agricultural, household, and industrial goods. In 2023, the top export from Afghanistan to Tajikistan was **fresh tropical fruits**, such as tamarinds, lychees, passion fruits, and other similar produce. These fruits were exported to a value of \$1.30 million.

Brooms and brushes, made from vegetable materials bound together, were the second-largest export from Afghanistan to Tajikistan, valued at \$0.41 million. **Fresh cucumbers and gherkins** were another notable export, with \$0.34 million worth of produce sent to Tajikistan.

Fuel wood, in logs and similar forms, was exported from Afghanistan to Tajikistan, valued at \$0.34 million. Lastly, **floor coverings**, including self-adhesive rolls and tiles, were exported at a value of \$0.19 million.

In 2023, Afghanistan's top import from Tajikistan was **electrical energy**, amounting to \$57.04 million. This ranked first among the imported products. The import of electrical energy has been consistently high over the years, with \$72.83 million in 2022 and \$57.89 million in 2021.

Portland cement, excluding white cement, ranked second, with a value of \$13.99 million imported in 2023. Imports of Cement slightly decreased from \$14.58 million in 2022 and \$18.42 million in 2021. **Wheat or meslin flour** was the third most imported product, totaling \$3.47 million in 2023. The import of flour has to \$2.87 million in 2022 from \$1.15 million in 2021.

Light oils and petroleum products, ranked fourth, with imports valued at \$2.86 million in 2023. This category saw a sharp increase compared to previous years. Lastly, **coal**, ranked fifth among the top imports, amounting to \$0.49 million in 2023. Although the import of coal dropped significantly from \$5.70 million in 2022.

3.5.2.1 Afghanistan Category-Wise Trade with Tajikistan

The **edible fruits** and **nuts** category is the largest contributor to Afghanistan's exports to Tajikistan, reflecting the country's rich agricultural resources. In 2023, this category generated \$1.64 million, driven primarily by the export of fresh tamarinds, cashew apples, and jackfruit, which alone accounted for \$1.30 million. The diversity of fruits available for export included almonds, dried grapes, and dried apricots.

The second category, **edible vegetables and certain roots** are also growing, with exports totaling \$0.50 million in 2023. This growth has been largely fueled by the rising popularity of fresh cucumbers and gherkins, which generated \$0.34 million in revenue. Other notable products included fresh or chilled potatoes and tomatoes.

Miscellaneous Manufactured Articles, ranked third, saw exports of \$0.41 million in 2023, primarily from brooms and brushes. The **wood and articles of the wood** category ranked fourth, generating \$0.38 million in exports, predominantly from fuel wood. Lastly, the **oil seeds and oleaginous fruits** category ranked fifth, with exports totaling \$0.27 million in 2023. This sector focuses on specialty crops like alfalfa seed.

In 2023, Afghanistan's primary import from Tajikistan was in the **mineral fuels and oils products of their distillation category**, which ranked first and amounted to \$60.39 million. This significant value is primarily driven by the import of electrical energy, which alone accounted for \$57.04 million.

The salt, sulfur, earths, and stone; plastering materials, lime, and cement category ranked second, with imports amounting to \$14.00 million in 2023. Most of this value stemmed from Portland cement, which totaled \$13.99 million. This sector has shown a slight decline from \$14.59 million in 2022.

Ranked third, **products of the milling industry** contributed \$3.49 million to Afghanistan's imports in 2023, primarily from wheat or meslin flour at \$3.47 million. This category has seen growth from \$2.87 million in 2022 and \$1.15 million in 2021.

The imports of lac; gums, resins, and other vegetable saps and extracts, which ranked fourth, were valued at \$0.38 million in 2023. This category has experienced fluctuations in value over the years, significantly dropping from \$5.46 million in 2022.

The imports of vehicles ranked fifth, with imports totaling \$0.35 million in 2023. This category includes trailers, motor vehicles for transporting goods, and bicycle parts, and has slightly increased from \$0.13 million in 2022 and \$0.18 million in 2021.

3.5.3 Afghanistan's Products and category Wise Trade with Iran

Afghanistan primarily exports agricultural goods, raw materials, and some industrial products to Iran. These include oil seeds, sunflower seeds, plants and plant-based products, coffee, tea, maté, and spices, along with minerals such as lead and articles thereof. Additional exports include edible vegetables, cotton, and live animals, reflecting a strong reliance on agricultural and natural resources.

Afghanistan imports a wide range of industrial and processed goods from Iran these imports include mineral fuels and oils, and a variety of plastic products, such as polyethylene and packaging materials like plates, sheets, films, and bottles. Other key imports include organic chemicals, dairy products, and edible fruits and nuts.

In 2022, Afghanistan exported \$4.26 million worth of **sunflower seeds** to Iran, marking a substantial increase from \$2.58 million in 2021. Exports of **unwrought lead**, **refined**, amounted to \$3.35 million in 2022, showcasing a resurgence in this product's trade. Notably, there were no recorded exports in 2021 and 2020, but there was a small export of \$0.87 million in 2019.

In 2022, the export value of **plants and parts of plants** reached \$2.58 million, a decline from \$4.10 million in 2021. Exports of **sesamum seeds** were valued at \$2.31 million in 2022, a slight decrease from \$2.52 million in 2021. This product has seen a steady rise in exports over the years, increasing from \$1.22 million in 2020. The export of **dried**, **shelled kidney beans** reached \$1.50 million in 2022, significantly up from \$0.62 million in 2021.

Light oils and preparations of petroleum ranked as the top imported products of Afghanistan from Iran, amounting to \$281.22 million in 2022. **Medium oils and preparations** followed as the second most significant import, valued at \$100.67 million in 2022, reflecting an increase from \$85.09 million in 2021. **Cyclic hydrocarbons** ranked third, with imports valued at \$49.68 million in 2022, marking a substantial rise from \$25.05 million in 2021.

Fresh apples take the fourth position among the top 25 product imports, with a value of \$43.70 million in 2022. Although this represents a slight decline from \$50.53 million in 2021. Polyethylene, ranked fifth, valued at \$34.11 million in 2022. This category showed an increase from \$20.68 million in 2021.

3.5.3.1 Afghanistan Category-Wise Trade with Iran

The **Oil Seeds and Oleaginous Fruits** category has emerged as the leading contributor to Afghanistan's exports to Iran, valued at \$11.72 million in 2022, up from \$10.88 million the previous year. This category's prominence is underscored by the export of sunflower seeds, which alone generated \$4.26 million. Other significant products include plants and parts used in perfumery and pharmacy, contributing \$2.58 million, and sesamum seeds, accounting for \$2.31 million.

In addition to oil seeds, Afghanistan also exported **Coffee, Tea, Maté, and Spices,** which ranked second with contributions of \$3.81 million in 2022, a notable increase from \$2.89 million in 2021. Moreover, **the Lead and Articles Thereof** category saw exports valued at \$3.35 million in 2022, with unwrought lead being the primary product.

The sector of **Edible Vegetables** also made significant contributions, exporting goods worth \$2.71 million in 2022, an increase from \$0.94 million in 2021. Dried shelled kidney beans were particularly prominent, generating \$1.50 million. Lastly, the **Cotton** category rounded out the top five, contributing \$2.29 million in exports in 2022, up from \$1.51 million in 2021.

The leading category in imports was **Mineral Fuels and Oils**, which amounted to \$556.88 million in 2022, although this was down from \$657.97 million in 2021, with light oils and preparations alone contributing \$281.22 million.

Following this, **Plastics and Articles Thereof** ranked as the second largest import category, valued at \$162.28 million in 2022. Key products included polyethylene and various forms of plastic sheets and articles. In the realm of agriculture, **Edible Fruits and Nuts** saw imports decline to \$91.80 million in 2022 from \$106.98 million in 2021. Fresh apples remained the primary product, valued at \$43.70 million.

Organic Chemicals constituted another vital area of imports, reaching \$65.49 million in 2022, up from \$49.43 million the previous year. Major products in this category included cyclic hydrocarbons and butene. Lastly, **Dairy Produce** imports totaled \$57.63 million in 2022, an increase from \$52.22 million in 2021. Products such as milk and cream with higher fat content dominated this Category.

3.5.4 Afghanistan's Products and category Wise Trade with Uzbekistan

Afghanistan primarily exports agricultural produce and raw materials to Uzbekistan, these exports include edible fruits and nuts, such as fresh or dried almonds in the shell, cotton, oil seeds, oleaginous fruits, and edible vegetables, including certain roots and tubers.

On the other hand, Afghanistan imports essential industrial and processed goods from Uzbekistan. Key imports include products of the milling industry, mineral fuels and oils, and edible vegetables. Additionally, Afghanistan sources animal, vegetable, or microbial fats and oils and their cleavage products from Uzbekistan.

The tables below list the top exports from Afghanistan to Uzbekistan and the top imports into Afghanistan from Uzbekistan.

Cotton ranks first among Afghanistan's exports to Uzbekistan, generating \$1.72 million in 2022, up from \$1.12 million in 2021. **Fresh or dried almonds** in shell is the second leading export, accounting for \$1.07 million in 2022, a significant increase from just \$0.07 million in 2021.

Dried apricots hold the third position, with exports valued at \$0.91 million in 2022, compared to \$0.07 million in 2021. **Sesamum seeds** come in fourth, totaling **\$0.89 million** in exports for 2023. This is the first year for which this product has been exported.

The export of **fresh or chilled potatoes** from Afghanistan to Uzbekistan ranks fifth, contributing \$0.86 million in 2022. This figure marks a notable decline from \$1.74 million in 2021, which in turn was a significant increase from \$0.02 million in 2020. In 2019, exports were also low, contributing a mere \$0.02 million.

Afghanistan's imports of wheat or meslin flour **rank first**, totaling \$268.53 million in 2022, a slight decrease from \$281.01 million in 2021.

Electrical energy imports were valued at \$82.47 million in 2022, down from \$91.49 million in 2021. There is a steady decline from \$133.19 million in 2020 to \$82.47 million in 2022. **Light oils and preparations** take third place, with imports accounting for \$33.01 million in 2022, significantly up from \$6.59 million in 2021.

In 2022, **liquefied propane** secured fourth place among Afghanistan's imports from Uzbekistan, totaling \$22.31 million. This marked a significant increase from \$9.65 million in 2021. **Dried, shelled beans** round up the top five imports, amounting to \$21.63 million in 2022. This figure represents a decrease from \$23.08 million in 2021.

3.5.4.1 Afghanistan Category-Wise Trade with Uzbekistan

Afghanistan's leading export category to Uzbekistan was **Edible Fruits and Nuts, c**ontributing \$2.05 million to total exports. This category showcased a variety of notable products, including fresh or dried almonds, both in shell and shelled forms, as well as dried apricots. The Cotton sector generated \$1.98 million in exports from Afghanistan to Uzbekistan. This category was predominantly composed of uncarded cotton.

In the **Oil Seeds and Oleaginous Fruits** category, Afghanistan's exports totaled \$1.48 million. Key products in this category included sesame seeds and a range of vegetable seeds. Additionally, the **Coffee**, **Tea**, **Maté**, **and Spices** category accounted for \$0.45 million in exports to Uzbekistan, with cumin seeds emerging as the standout product. Finally, the fifth category, **Edible Vegetables** contributed \$0.96 million to Afghanistan's exports. Fresh potatoes were the primary item exported.

Afghanistan imports a significant quantity of **Products of the Milling Industry**, which is ranked first among its imports from Uzbekistan, amounting to \$268.80 million. The primary product in this category is wheat or meslin flour, which alone accounted for \$268.53 million. Another critical area of import is **Mineral Fuels and Oils**, ranked second, totaling \$150.25 million. Key products include electrical energy, valued at \$82.47 million.

Afghanistan also imports **Edible Vegetables**, which ranks third, totaling \$27.59 million. Notable items include dried, shelled beans at \$21.63 million and fresh or chilled onions at \$1.92 million.

The Animal, Vegetable, or Microbial Fats and Oils and Their Cleavage Products category ranks fourth with imports amounting to \$25.19 million. The leading products include crude sunflower-seed oil valued at \$11.41 million and edible mixtures of fats at \$7.14 million. Lastly, Afghanistan's imports of fertilizers are positioned in fifth place, amounting to \$18.92 million in 2022. Key items within this category include urea, valued at \$7.98 million, and diammonium phosphate, at \$5.56 million in 2022.



Chapter: 4

Afghanistan Trade with Key Non-bordering Regional Countries

4.1 Afghanistan Trade Overview with Other Key Regional Countries

In this section, we will explore Afghanistan's trade relations with key non-bordering regional countries—China, Kazakhstan, India, Turkey, and the United Arab Emirates (UAE). Currently, Afghanistan is trading with more than 60 non-border countries; however, we have selected these top five countries to provide a focused trade analysis, as they play a vital role in Afghanistan's trade network. Data for 2023 for Afghanistan's trade with the UAE is not available, hence for the UAE an estimated value has been used.

4.2 Country-Wise Trade pattern of Afghanistan with Key Non-Bordering

Regional Countries

In this study, we present Afghanistan's total exports and imports with its key non-bordering regional countries, highlighting the countries with which Afghanistan has the highest levels of exports and imports. The details of this analysis are provided in the following table.

The table provides an overview of Afghanistan's trade with key non-bordering regional countries from 2019 to 2023, showcasing the key players in both imports and exports. China stands out as Afghanistan's top key regional import partner, with imports reaching \$1,269.78 million in 2023, a substantial increase from \$553.1 million in 2022. On the export side, India leads, with Afghanistan exporting goods worth \$666.15 million in 2023, marking a significant rise from \$414.75 million in 2022.

Kazakhstan ranks third in imports, with \$615.51 million in 2023, though this reflects a decline from \$978.9 million in 2022. Exports to Kazakhstan, however, remain modest at \$21.17 million in 2023. India is Afghanistan's third-largest source of imports, with \$362.34 million in 2023, down from \$481.6 million in 2022.

In 2023, Afghanistan's exports to China were dominated by **fresh or dried pine nuts**, which held the top position with a value of \$57.24 million, a significant rise from \$34.22 million in 2022. This product's export was relatively new, as it wasn't recorded in previous years, demonstrating its growing demand in China. Following in second place, **dried apricots** generated \$3.32 million in 2023, up from \$2.78 million in 2022.

Ranked third, **coarse animal hair**, accounted for \$1.46 million in 2023, up slightly from \$1.33 million in 2022, though it had seen a higher export value of \$1.97 million in 2021.

Precious stones and semi-precious stones secured fourth position with exports valued at \$0.84 million in 2023, an increase from \$0.60 million in 2022 and \$0.38 million in 2021. Lastly, in fifth place, Afghan **carpets and other textile floor coverings of wool or fine animal hair** reached \$0.19 million in exports to China in 2023, up from \$0.07 million in 2022.

In 2023, Afghanistan's imports from China were led by **commodities not elsewhere specified**, totaling \$306.45 million, a dramatic increase from \$2.00 million in 2022 and \$0.70 million in 2019. The second-highest import was **woven fabrics of yarn**, which reached \$96.59 million in 2023, up significantly from \$27.43 million in 2022.

Imports of **new pneumatic tyres for buses and lorries** ranked third, amounting to \$67.07 million in 2023, a slight rise from \$63.37 million in 2022.

In fourth place were **motorcycles**, **including mopeds**, with a total import value of \$64.18 million in 2023. This category saw an increase from \$40.17 million in 2022 and a sharp rise compared to \$12.33 million in 2019. Rounding up the top five, **woven fabrics** reached \$59.51 million in imports for 2023, showing considerable growth from \$19.59 million in 2022 and \$7.39 million in 2019.

4.2.1.1 Afghanistan Category-Wise Trade with China

In 2023, Afghanistan's major export category to China continued to include a diverse range of products, with **edible fruits** and nuts remaining the dominant sector. Exports of edible fruit and nuts reached \$60.72 million, a significant increase from \$37.01 million in 2022. This category encompasses fresh or dried pine nuts, in shell (\$57.24 million), dried apricots (\$3.32 million), and dried grapes (\$0.17 million).

The wool, fine or coarse animal hair category saw exports of \$1.55 million in 2023, up slightly from \$1.34 million in 2022. This sector is represented by coarse animal hair (\$1.46 million), with a smaller share of shorn wool (\$0.09 million).

The **natural or cultured pearls and precious stones** category earned \$0.94 million in 2023, reflecting a rise from \$0.61 million in 2022. Key sub-categories include precious stones and semi-precious stones (\$0.84 million), worked precious stones (\$0.07 million), and rubies, sapphires, and emeralds (\$0.01 million).

The carpets and other textile floor covering category recorded \$0.33 million in exports in 2023, showing an increase from \$0.09 million in 2022. Notable sub-categories include knotted carpets of wool or fine animal hair (\$0.19 million), hand-woven rugs like Kelem and Schumacks (\$0.13 million), and woven carpets (\$0.01 million).

The **vegetable plaiting materials and vegetable products** category saw exports of \$0.13 million in 2023, slightly down from \$0.28 million in 2022. The primary export within this sector was vegetable products not elsewhere specified (\$0.13 million).

In 2023, Afghanistan's major import categories from China have exhibited significant growth, especially in the **commodities not elsewhere specified** category which saw a dramatic surge in 2023, reaching \$306.45 million, a significant rise from \$2.00 million in 2022.

The second important category is **electrical machinery and equipment**, which remained a dominant import category. Imports of electrical machinery and equipment amounted to \$153.06 million, showing a substantial increase from \$80.90 million in 2022. This category includes photovoltaic cells (\$55.71 million), static converters (\$30.24 million), and telephones for cellular networks (\$14.99 million), among others.

The man-made filaments category recorded \$141.29 million in imports, a sharp rise from \$46.70 million in 2022. This category includes textured polyester filaments used in fabric manufacturing, with woven fabrics of polyester filaments contributing \$96.59 million to the total.

The man-made staple fibres category also saw an increase, with imports reaching \$102.20 million in 2023, up from \$25.77 million in 2022. The primary imports in this category were woven fabrics containing predominantly polyester staple fibres (\$59.51 million) and polyester staple fibre fabrics, dyed (\$18.08 million).

The **rubber** and **articles thereof** category imported \$90.28 million worth of goods, a slight increase from \$78.80 million in 2022. Notable sub-categories include new pneumatic tyres for buses and lorries (\$67.07 million) and for motor cars (\$15.69 million).

4.2.2 Afghanistan's Products and category Wise Trade with Kazakhstan

Afghanistan primarily exports a range of agricultural products, these exports include beverages, spirits, and vinegar, such as mineral and aerated waters, along with edible fruits and nuts like fresh and dried grapes, tamarinds, cashew apples, jackfruit, and lychees. Additionally, Afghanistan exports edible vegetables and certain roots and tubers.

On the other hand, Afghanistan imports essential staple and industrial goods from Kazakhstan. Key imports include products of the milling industry, such as wheat or meslin flour, and cereals, including wheat and meslin (excluding seed for sowing and durum wheat). Afghanistan also imports iron and steel products, such as flat-rolled products of iron or non-alloy steel. Additionally, edible vegetables and certain roots and tubers form a part of Afghanistan's imports from Kazakhstan.

In 2023, Afghanistan's exports to Kazakhstan were led by waters (including mineral and aerated), totaling \$14.48 million, a substantial increase from \$3.06 million in 2022 and \$0.79 million in 2021.

The second most exported product was **non-alcoholic beverages**, amounting to \$1.87 million in 2023, up from \$1.57 million in 2022 and \$0.47 million in 2021. **Dried grapes** ranked third, with exports reaching \$1.31 million in 2023, a slight increase from \$1.15 million in 2022.

Fresh grapes were also notable, valued at \$0.73 million in 2023, though not present in earlier years, indicating a relatively new demand for this product in Kazakhstan. Finally, exports of plants and parts of plants (including seeds and fruits, used primarily in perfumery and pharmacy) reached \$0.51 million in 2023, significantly up from \$0.05 million in 2022 and \$0.01 million in 2021.

Afghanistan's imports from Kazakhstan in 2023 were dominated by wheat or meslin flour, totaling \$368.02 million, although this was a decrease from \$554.40 million in 2022. Wheat and meslin (excl. seed for sowing, and durum wheat) were the second-highest imports, valued at \$109.32 million in 2023, down from \$194.22 million in 2022.

Flat-rolled products of iron were also significant, with imports reaching \$18.41 million in 2023, a slight increase from \$18.15 million in 2022.

Imports of dried, shelled peas (Pisum sativum) stood at \$18.32 million in 2023, lower than \$30.37 million in 2022.

Finally, linseed, whether or not broken, was valued at \$13.88 million in 2023, down from \$31.13 million in 2022.

4.2.2.1 Afghanistan Category-Wise Trade with Kazakhstan

@In 2023, Afghanistan's major export category to Kazakhstan saw growth across several key categories, with beverages, edible fruits, and apparel being notable sectors.

The **beverages**, **spirits**, **and vinegar** category led exports with \$16.35 million in 2023, up significantly from \$4.63 million in 2022. This category includes non-alcoholic beverages such as flavored mineral and aerated waters, which alone contributed \$14.48 million, a marked increase from \$3.06 million in the previous year.

In the **edible fruits and nuts** category, exports reached \$2.25 million, key items in this category include dried grapes (\$1.31 million) and fresh grapes (\$0.73 million). Dried apricots and other dried fruits also contributed to this sector.

The edible vegetables and certain roots and tubers category recorded exports of \$0.57 million in 2023, with primary exports being fresh onions and shallots (\$0.48 million). Other vegetable exports include cucumbers, chilled cabbage, and tomatoes, catering to Kazakhstan's.

The **oil seeds and oleaginous fruits** category, though relatively minor, grew to \$0.53 million in 2023, led by plants and parts of plants used for perfumery and medicinal purposes (\$0.51 million).

Lastly, the articles of apparel and clothing accessories category reached \$0.34 million in exports in 2023, showing an increase from \$0.01 million in 2022. The main exports here include men's suits of synthetic fibers (\$0.30 million) and trousers.

In 2023, **Products of the milling industry** were Afghanistan's largest import from Kazakhstan, totaling \$368.46 million in 2023, although this marked a decrease from \$554.45 million in 2022. The bulk of this category is comprised of wheat or meslin flour, which alone contributed \$368.02 million.

The **cereals** sector was Afghanistan's second-largest import category, amounting to \$112.96 million in 2023. Most of this came from wheat and meslin (\$109.32 million), other cereals such as barley, durum wheat, oats, and rice made up smaller amounts.

Iron and steel imports reached \$37.25 million in 2023, down from \$61.60 million in 2022. The category primarily included flat-rolled products of iron or non-alloy steel, specific items like flat-rolled products in various forms and widths contributed notably to this sector.

Edible vegetables and certain roots and tubers totaled \$20.67 million in 2023, a slight decrease from \$32.71 million in 2022. Dried peas formed the majority of these imports (\$18.32 million), while lentils, chickpeas, onions, and garlic were also imported.

Animal and vegetable fats and oils rounded out the top five imports at \$20.53 million in 2023. Sunflower-seed and safflower oils dominated this sector, with both crude and refined forms making up over \$20 million.

4.2.3 Afghanistan's Products and category Wise Trade with India

Afghanistan's trade with India is characterized by a diverse flow of agricultural, industrial, and manufactured goods. Afghanistan primarily exports a variety of high-value agricultural products to India. These exports include edible fruits and nuts, such as fresh or dried figs, dried grapes, fresh apples, and shelled pistachios, lac, gums, resins, and other vegetable extracts. Coffee, tea and edible vegetables and roots are also significant exports to India.

On the other hand, Afghanistan imports a variety of industrial, healthcare, and textile products from India. Key imports include pharmaceutical products, such as medicaments and vaccines for therapeutic and prophylactic purposes. Afghanistan also imports articles of apparel and clothing accessories, including women's and girls' tracksuits, other garments and man-made staple fibers.

The major export and import products between Afghanistan and India are shown in the tables below. These tables provide a comprehensive view of the trade patterns and product categories.

In 2023, Afghanistan's exports to India were led by lac, natural gums, and resins, which reached \$155.76 million, up from \$125.78 million in 2022.

Following closely, **fresh or dried figs** ranked second, with exports totaling \$149.50 million in 2023, a notable rise from \$64.53 million in 2022.

Dried grapes came in third, amounting to \$82.17 million in 2023, a slight increase from \$78.59 million in 2022.

Afghanistan's **saffron** exports to India reached \$34.48 million in 2023, up substantially from \$12.53 million in 2022, indicating a rising trend.

Finally, **fresh apples** marked significant growth, totaling \$32.64 million in 2023, a sharp increase from just \$0.93 million in 2022.

Afghanistan's imports from India in 2023 were primarily led by **medicaments consisting of mixed or unmixed products**, totaling \$42.12 million, a slight increase from \$40.89 million in 2022.

The second largest import was of woven **fabrics**, **containing predominantly synthetic materials**, reaching \$26.62 million in 2023, up from \$14.73 million in 2022.

Vaccines for human medicine ranked third, with imports of \$26.16 million in 2023, increasing slightly from \$25.15 million in 2022.

Oilcake and other solid residues, commonly used for animal feed, reached \$25.80 million in 2023, a substantial increase from \$2.68 million in 2022.

Finally, women's or girls' tracksuits and related garments came in fifth, with imports valued at \$20.84 million in 2023, up from \$17.25 million in 2022.

4.2.3.1 Afghanistan Category-Wise Trade with India

In 2023, Afghanistan's major exports to India were dominated by edible fruits and nuts, natural resins, spices, vegetables, and oil seeds.

Edible Fruits and Nuts were Afghanistan's largest export to India, totaling \$366.20 million in 2023, up from \$225.31 million in 2022. The majority of this category was composed of fresh or dried figs, contributing \$149.50 million alone. Dried grapes were also significant, bringing in \$82.17 million, followed by fresh apples (\$32.64 million). Other fruits, such as pistachios, almonds, dried apricots, and walnuts, rounded out this category.

Lac, Gums, and Resins ranked as the second-largest export category, with a total value of \$155.76 million in 2023, up from \$125.79 million in 2022. This category mainly consists of natural gums and resins, which are essential for India's pharmaceutical, cosmetic, and food industries.

Coffee, tea, maté and spices formed the third-largest export category, totaling \$63.01 million in 2023. The most prominent item was saffron, contributing \$34.48 million. Other key exports included juniper berries and seeds like caraway and fennel, which together brought in \$23.29 million.

Edible Vegetables and Certain Roots and Tubers amounted to \$54.67 million in 2023, fresh garlic was the main contributor (\$31.49 million). Dried beans and onions were also notable exports.

Oil Seeds and Oleaginous Fruits rounded up the top five exports, totaling \$21.41 million in 2023, up from \$12.20 million in 2022. This category includes medicinal and industrial plants, with plants primarily used in perfumery and pharmacy contributing \$16.97 million.

Pharmaceutical Products were Afghanistan's largest import from India, reaching \$88.15 million in 2023, an increase from \$85.83 million in 2022. This category is primarily composed of therapeutic medicaments (\$42.12 million), vaccines for human medicine (\$26.16 million), and antibiotic-containing medicines (\$10.46 million).

Articles of Apparel and Clothing Accessories ranked as the second-largest import category, totaling \$44.08 million in 2023. Key items include women's tracksuits and other garments made of synthetic fibers (\$20.84 million), and ensembles and dresses also made from synthetic fibers.

Man-Made Staple Fibers accounted for \$30.58 million in 2023, up from \$19.05 million in 2022. This category is mainly driven by woven polyester fabrics, with products containing a significant portion of polyester staple fibers being particularly popular.

Residues and Waste from the Food Industries; Prepared Animal Fodder totaled \$26.04 million in 2023, showing a sharp increase from just \$3.02 million in 2022. Oilcake and other solid residues made up nearly all imports in this sector (\$25.80 million).

Vehicles and Parts rounded up the top imports from India, reaching \$19.72 million in 2023, up from \$7.86 million in 2022. This category primarily includes motor vehicles for passenger transport (\$10.25 million), along with agricultural tractors and motorcycles.

4.2.4 Afghanistan's Product and category Wise Trade with Turkey

Afghanistan's trade with Turkey encompasses a variety of agricultural exports and industrial imports. Afghanistan primarily exports agricultural products and raw materials to Turkey, with key exports including edible fruits and nuts, such as dried apricots, dried grapes, and both fresh and dried pistachios and almonds. Additionally, Afghanistan exports oil seeds and oleaginous fruits, raw hides and skins (other than furskins) along with leather, and carpets and other textile floor coverings.

On the other hand, Afghanistan imports a range of industrial and manufactured products from Turkey. Notable imports include electrical machinery and equipment and parts thereof. Additionally, Afghanistan imports nuclear reactors, boilers, and machinery, animal, vegetable, or microbial fats and oils.

The top exports and imports between Afghanistan and Turkey are listed in the tables below.

In 2023, Afghanistan's top export to Turkey was **dried apricots**, with exports reaching \$7.49 million, up significantly from \$0.83 million in 2022.

Sesamum seeds followed, with exports valued at \$3.85 million in 2023, a marked increase from \$0.13 million in 2022.

Dried grapes ranked third, generating \$3.03 million in exports to Türkiye in 2023, up from \$1.19 million in 2022.

Carpets and other textile floor coverings of Afghan origin secured fourth place, with exports totaling \$2.40 million in 2023, a rise from \$1.78 million in 2022.

Finally, whole raw hides and skins of bovine amounted to \$2.30 million in exports in 2023, although it was down from \$3.61 million in 2022.

Afghanistan's imports from Turkey in 2023 were led by **sunflower-seed or safflower oil and their fractions**, totaling \$19.93 million. This figure marks a decrease from \$44.81 million in 2022.

Oilcake and other solid residues, predominantly used for animal feed, were Afghanistan's second-largest import from Turkey, valued at \$19.01 million in 2023, nearly doubling from \$10.09 million in 2022.

Isocyanates ranked third, with imports of \$12.32 million in 2023, rising from \$9.49 million in 2022.

In fourth place, wheat or meslin flour imports amounted to \$10.20 million in 2023, a decline from \$12.48 million in 2022.

Finally, articles of jewelry and parts thereof reached \$8.06 million in 2023, slightly down from \$8.49 million in 2022.

4.2.4.1 Afghanistan Category-Wise Trade with Turkey

In 2023, Afghanistan's major export category to Turkey featured a range of essential goods, with significant contributions from fruit, oil seeds, raw hides, carpets, and animal products.

Edible Fruits and Nuts led the export category, amounting to \$13.55 million, an increase from \$6.16 million in 2022. Dried apricots (\$7.49 million) were the primary export in this category, followed by dried grapes (\$3.03 million) and pistachios (shelled: \$1.98 million). Other items, including almonds and pine nuts, also contributed in smaller amounts.

Oil Seeds and Oleaginous Fruits totaled \$4.96 million in exports, primarily driven by sesamum seeds (\$3.85 million). Other exports in this category included fruit stones and medicinal plants.

Raw Hides and Skins exports to Turkey amounted to \$4.23 million, marking a slight decrease from \$5.27 million in 2022. Major items included whole raw hides and skins of bovine animals (\$2.30 million) and raw sheep or lamb skins (\$1.08 million).

Carpets and Textile Floor Coverings exported to Turkey totaled \$2.64 million, up from \$1.91 million in 2022. Wool carpets (\$2.40 million) were the primary item, followed by smaller quantities of hand-woven rugs.

Products of Animal Origin (not elsewhere specified) were valued at \$2.04 million. The majority comprised products unfit for human consumption, such as animal products (\$1.76 million).

In 2023, Afghanistan's major import category from Turkey encompassed a variety of essential products, including Electrical Machinery and Equipment, Machinery and Mechanical Appliances, Animal, Vegetable, and Microbial Fats and Oils, Residues and Waste from the Food Industries and Organic Chemicals.

Electrical Machinery and Equipment was Afghanistan's largest import category from Turkey, totaling \$31.44 million in 2023, a slight increase from \$29.63 million in 2022. Leading items include diesel-generating sets (\$5.57 million), lead-acid accumulators (\$2.70 million), and apparatus for circuit protection (\$2.56 million).

Machinery and Mechanical Appliances ranked second, amounting to \$22.96 million in 2023. Key imports in this category were parts for lifts and escalators (\$4.55 million), diesel engines (\$3.49 million), parts suitable for use solely or principally with compression-ignition, centrifugal pumps, power-driven and parts of central heating boilers.

Animal, Vegetable, and Microbial Fats and Oils accounted for \$21.19 million in 2023, down from a high of \$47.57 million in 2022. Sunflower-seed oil dominated this sector, making up \$19.93 million of the total imports.

Residues and Waste from the Food Industries reached \$19.55 million in 2023, up from \$10.32 million in 2022. This category primarily consisted of oilcake and other solid residues (\$19.01 million).

Organic Chemicals rounded out the top imports at \$15.16 million in 2023, a rise from \$11.82 million in 2022. Major imports included isocyanates (\$12.32 million) and adipic acid (\$0.92 million).

4.2.5 Afghanistan's Products and Category Wise Trade with United Arab Emirates

In this section we discuss Afghanistan's trade with the United Arab Emirates (UAE) which comprises of a diverse mix of agricultural exports and industrial imports. Afghanistan primarily exports agricultural products and raw materials to the UAE, with notable exports including edible fruits and nuts such as dried grapes, fresh or dried almonds (both shelled and, in the shell,), fresh or dried figs, and pistachios. Additionally, Afghanistan exports natural or cultured pearls, precious or semi-precious stones, and gold, including gold plated with platinum. Other key exports include coffee, tea, maté, spices, and Afghanistan's traditional carpets and textile floor coverings.

In return, Afghanistan imports a variety of industrial goods and consumer products from the UAE. These imports include tobacco and manufactured tobacco substitutes, as well as electrical machinery and equipment and parts. Afghanistan also imports natural or cultured pearls, precious or semi-precious stones, and vehicles (excluding railway or tramway rolling stock), along with rubber and rubber products.

The detailed export and import of products between Afghanistan and the UAE are listed in the tables below. These tables provide a comprehensive view of the trade flows and product categories.

In recent years, Afghanistan's exports to the United Arab Emirates (UAE) have included **Gold, including gold plated with platinum,** with values of \$9.10 million in 2022, \$418.94 million in 2021, \$540.32 million in 2020, and an impressive \$967.69 million in 2019. However, there were no reported exports of gold to the UAE in 2023.

Dried grapes ranked as the second major export, amounting to \$5.50 million in 2022, although down from \$12.62 million in 2021.

Fresh or dried almonds (shelled) followed closely, with exports to the UAE valued at \$2.31 million in 2022. Earlier years saw slight variations in demand, with exports recorded at \$3.35 million in 2021.

Fresh or dried figs were also a notable export, reaching \$1.94 million in 2022. Previous years maintained steady figures, with exports of \$1.32 million in 2021.

Finally, **cumin seeds**, **unprocessed**, represented a valuable export for Afghanistan, totaling \$1.31 million in 2022. This export category saw some fluctuation over the years, with values recorded at \$2.03 million in 2021.

Afghanistan's top imports from the United Arab Emirates (UAE) in recent years have varied across different categories. **Cigarettes containing tobacco** topped the import list, with a value of \$347.01 million in 2022. This shows a decrease from \$459.03 million in 2020.

The UAE has also been a major supplier of **articles of jewelry and parts thereof**, with imports valued at \$123.92 million in 2022, up from \$87.52 million in 2021. **Smartphones for wireless networks**, listed at \$110.23 million in 2022, and have emerged as a significant import category.

Parts and accessories for tractors and motor vehicles ranked among the essential imports, with values recorded at \$70.76 million in 2022 and \$48.55 million in 2021.

Medium oils and preparations have also been consistent imports, reaching \$48.05 million in 2022. Previous imports totaled \$42.29 million in 2021.

4.2.5.1 Afghanistan Category-Wise Trade with the United Arab Emirates

Edible Fruits and Nuts was Afghanistan's largest export category to the UAE, though no specific 2023 data is available. In 2022, this category reached \$13.83 million, a decline from previous years, such as \$24.32 million in 2021. Key exports in this category included dried grapes (\$5.50 million), shelled almonds (\$2.31 million), dried figs (\$1.94 million), shelled pistachios (\$1.26 million), in-shell almonds (\$0.45 million), shelled pine nuts (\$0.41 million), fresh plums and sloes (\$0.32 million), dried apricots (\$0.28 million), and in-shell pine nuts (\$0.24 million).

Precious Metals and Stones ranked as another significant category, with exports reaching \$9.74 million in 2022. This category was primarily led by unwrought gold (\$9.10 million), while rubies, sapphires, and emeralds contributed \$0.59 million.

Coffee, Tea, and Spices totaled \$2.81 million in 2022. Key exports included non-crushed cumin seeds (\$1.31 million), crushed cumin seeds (\$0.61 million), saffron (\$0.67 million), cardamom (\$0.15 million), and coriander seeds in both crushed and non-crushed forms.

Edible Vegetables and Certain Roots and Tubers reached \$2.34 million in 2022, led by dried, shelled leguminous vegetables (\$0.93 million), dried beans of specific species (\$0.78 million), and other beans and leguminous crops. Fresh and chilled onions and shallots (\$0.01 million) also contributed.

Oil Seeds and Miscellaneous Grains contributed \$1.29 million in 2022, led by fruit stones and kernels (\$1.02 million). Other key exports included seeds of forage plants (\$0.14 million) and sesame seeds (\$0.07 million).


In 2022, Tobacco and Manufactured Tobacco Products was Afghanistan's largest import category from the UAE i, valued at \$360.27 million. Key items included cigarettes containing tobacco (\$347.01 million), smoking tobacco (\$7.43 million), water-pipe tobacco (\$3.35 million), and chewing tobacco (\$1.14 million).

Electrical Machinery and Equipment represented a substantial import category, totaling \$179.42 million in 2022. Major imports included smartphones for wireless networks (\$110.23 million), lead-acid accumulators (\$9.57 million), sparking plugs (\$4.66 million), LEDs (\$4.51 million), and flash memory devices (\$4.06 million).

Precious Metals and Stones ranked third as a significant import sector, amounting to \$137.97 million in 2022. This category was primarily led by articles of jewelry and parts thereof (\$123.92 million) and unwrought gold for non-monetary purposes (\$14.03 million).

Vehicles and Automotive Parts reached \$98.37 million in imports from the UAE in 2022. Key items included parts and accessories for various vehicles (\$70.76 million), motor cars for passenger transport (\$8.09 million), clutches (\$7.07 million), and suspension systems (\$2.24 million).

Machinery and Mechanical Appliances totaled \$83.25 million in 2022, with top imports such as portable data-processing machines (\$14.32 million), ball bearings (\$7.43 million), air conditioning machines (\$6.93 million), and engine parts (\$5.56 million).



Chapter: 5

Common Products Imported by Afghanistan

5.1 Afghanistan Major Imports from Pakistan and Border/Non-Border Countries

In this chapter, we analyze products that Pakistan produces but has not yet been able to export to Afghanistan in significant volumes. By closely examining the types of goods that regional competitors are exporting to Afghanistan—particularly those that overlap with Pakistan's own production capabilities—we aim to identify opportunities for increasing Pakistan's export share.

We explore Afghanistan's top 50 imported products from Pakistan, its bordering countries, and key non-bordering trading partners. The purpose is to analyze Afghanistan's import trends and identify opportunities for Pakistan to expand its exports in the Afghan market. The table below provides a detailed breakdown of Afghanistan's total imports in 2023, showcasing the significant trade volumes with Pakistan, China, India, Iran, Kazakhstan, and others.

In 2023, Afghanistan's total imports from all countries amounted to \$4.33 billion. The largest share came from China, with imports totaling \$1.27 billion. Pakistan followed, with imports worth \$0.98 billion. Kazakhstan ranked third, contributing \$0.62 billion. India supplied goods worth \$0.36 billion and Turkey \$0.26 billion. Other notable contributors in 2022 included Iran with imports valued at \$1.65 billion, and the UAE, which contributed \$1.22 billion. Lastly, Uzbekistan accounted for \$0.52 billion in imports.

In 2023, Afghanistan's top five imported products reflect a diverse range of essential goods. Wheat or meslin flour (HS Code: 110100) topped the list, with total imports of \$381.72 million, primarily sourced from Kazakhstan (\$368.02 million) and smaller contributions from Pakistan. Palm oil and its fractions (HS Code: 151190) ranked second, with imports amounting to \$330.17 million.

The third-highest imported product was **Commodities not elsewhere specified** (HS Code: 999999), valued at \$312.59 million, with a significant portion of \$306.45 million coming from China.

Food preparations (HS Code: 210690) followed, with total imports of \$126.97 million, largely supplied by Pakistan \$84.90 million and UAE \$5.86 million. Lastly, **Medicaments for therapeutic purposes** (HS Code: 300490) totaled \$117.06 million, with Pakistan accounting for \$55.69 million and India \$42.12 million.



The analysis from above table highlights significant available export opportunities for Pakistan in the Afghan market, particularly in products already imported from regional competitors. Despite Pakistan's strong trade ties with Afghanistan, its exports remain underrepresented in key product categories where other countries, such as China, India, Iran, and Kazakhstan, dominate.



Chapter: 6

Promoting Pakistan Afghanistan Bilateral Trade

6.1 Input from Relevant Stakeholders

Inputs were taken from the relevant stakeholders from Pakistan in Peshawar who are involved in trade with Afghanistan. These interviews were facilitated by the Sarhad Chambers of Commerce & Industry (SCCI). A detailed list of the stakeholders interviewed is given in "Annexure N.1³⁶", some of the interviewees included, the current **President** of the Sarhad Chamber of Commerce & Industry Peshawar (SCCI), **Senior Vice President** of Pakistan Afghanistan Joint Chamber of Commerce and Industry (PAJCCI), **Chairman** Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Chamber of Commerce & Industry, **Former President** Sarhad Chamber of Commerce & Industry Peshawar (SCCI), **Director General** Trade Development Authority of Pakistan (TDAP) Peshawar and the **Chief Collector** Customs Peshawar,

Afghanistan is an important market of about 42.24 million people with a GDP of \$13.92 billion. Economically, Afghanistan remains heavily reliant on agriculture, with the sector providing employment to a large portion of its population. Key agricultural products include wheat, fruits, nuts, and livestock. Despite its vast natural resources, including minerals and precious metals, the country faces significant barriers to fully leveraging these assets due to infrastructure challenges, security issues and political instability. The informal economy also plays a substantial role, particularly in rural areas where formal economic activities are less accessible.

In terms of trade, Afghanistan occupies a strategic location as a landlocked country at the crossroads of Central and South Asia. This position offers significant potential as a trade hub, connecting regional markets. However, its trade environment is marked by challenges, including dependency on imports, limited export diversification, and reliance on neighboring countries such as Pakistan, Iran, and Uzbekistan. Key exports include dried fruits, nuts, and carpets, while major imports consist of food, petroleum products, pharmaceuticals products and machinery.

Efforts to enhance Pakistan-Afghanistan bilateral trade face hurdles, such as political uncertainty, a lack of infrastructure, and an underdeveloped regulatory framework. The opportunities and challenges are discussed in detail below.

6.2 Opportunities and Challenges in Pakistan-Afghanistan Bilateral Trade

Opportunities

The following commodities were identified with the most potential for Pakistan to export to Afghanistan.



Cereals

Rice Basmati, Broken Rice, Rice other Varieties and Maize



Pharmaceutical products

Vitamins, Antibiotics, Harmone not Antibiotics, and other medicaments



Edible Vegetables and Fruit

Potatoes, Tomatoes, Kino, Bananas, Mangoes



Mineral Products

White Portland Cement, Himalayan Rock salt and Other Portland Cement



Animal and Animal Products

Dairy and Meats



Biscuits

Sandwich biscuits, cookies, tea biscuits, crackers etc.

Cereal Products

Pakistan has a significant potential to expand its export of cereal products to Afghanistan, where there is a growing demand for high-quality rice varieties, including Basmati, broken rice, and other rice types, as well as for maize.

Pharmaceutical products

- Pakistan has a promising opportunity to expand its export of vitamins to Afghanistan, where there is a rising demand for health and nutrition-related products.
- Pakistan can capitalize on the growing demand for antibiotics in the Afghan market by leveraging its competitive pharmaceutical industry. By ensuring a steady supply of high-quality products, Pakistan can enhance its trade presence and support Afghanistan's healthcare sector effectively.

Edible Vegetables and Fruit

- Pakistan has a strong opportunity in exports of edible vegetables, particularly potatoes and tomatoes, to Afghanistan.
 With high demand and proximity advantages, Pakistan can play a crucial role in meeting Afghanistan's vegetable needs.
- There is substantial demand for edible fruits such as kino, bananas, and mangoes in the Afghan market. These fruits, being popular and widely consumed, present a valuable opportunity for Pakistan to enhance its exports and strengthen its trade ties with Afghanistan.
- Beyond Afghanistan, Uzbekistan has a strong demand for mango juice, presenting an excellent opportunity for Pakistan to export this product via Afghanistan, leveraging its geographic proximity and trade routes.

Mineral Products

 The Afghan market has a consistent demand for mineral products such as White Portland Cement, Himalayan Rock Salt, and Other Portland Cement. These products are crucial for construction and daily use, offering Pakistan a promising opportunity to expand its export to Afghanistan.

Animal and Animal Products

- Pakistan has a strong opportunity to export animal products, including dairy, beef, and chicken, to Afghanistan due to
 rising demand in the market. This presents an opportunity to become a key supplier, leveraging geographical proximity.
- Uzbekistan and other central Asian countries have high demand for meat products, and Pakistan can access these market via Afghanistan.

Biscuits

- Pakistan has strong export opportunities for biscuits to Afghanistan and Central Asia, including popular varieties like strawberry, lemon sandwich, Super Power, and Sheer Magic.
- Pakistan also has strong potential to export these biscuits to Central Asian countries through Afghanistan, capitalizing
 on growing demand and regional connectivity.

6.3 Transit Trade Route to Central Asia

- Pakistan has significant opportunities to export goods to Uzbekistan and other Central Asian countries through Afghanistan. Key export products to the Central Asian countries include mango juice, meat, cereal products and pharmaceutical products.
- Leveraging Afghanistan as a transit hub offers a cost-effective and efficient pathway to reach these markets. Strengthening transit agreements, streamlining customs procedures, and improving transport infrastructure can further enhance trade flows and unlock the potential for Pakistani exporters to expand their presence in the Central Asian region.

6.4 Trade Route Between Pakistan and Afghanistan

The trade route between Pakistan and Afghanistan faces multiple challenges, including frequent border closures, high tariffs, and inefficient logistics, which hinder smooth trade flows. The absence of a formal banking system and a heavy export Cess further reduces trade competitiveness, pushing traders toward alternative routes like Iran.

6.4.1. Common Issues Face by Traders

- The Sarhad Chamber of Commerce highlighted that over 500 trucks of potatoes are sold daily to Afghanistan, from where they are exported to Central Asian countries and Dubai. These potatoes are sold to Afghanistan in Pakistani Rupees, but Afghan traders then sell them in dollars, causing the dollar earnings to go to third parties. While Pakistan supplies the potatoes, Afghanistan and other intermediaries are profiting in dollars by exporting the same product to Central Asian countries and Dubai.
- Hand-made carpets used to be an export worth two billion rupees, but their exports have significantly decreased. This decline is due to Turkey's actions, as they relocated Afghan hand-made carpet weavers from Pakistan to Turkey. In Turkey, these artisans were provided a village to live in and were given Turkish nationality, leading to a major shift in production and export capacity from Pakistan to Turkey. Additionally, the Pakistani government should avoid harassing those who contribute to the country's exports. Many Afghan carpet makers faced various difficulties in Pakistan, prompting them to either return to Afghanistan or move to Turkey, where they received better support and facilities. As a result, Pakistan's export of hand-made carpets has declined considerably.
- The Sarhad Chamber of Commerce stated that not all issues are related to security. Pakistani businessmen exporting perishable items, such as tomatoes and fruits, are facing challenges. Recently, they received an order from Afghanistan

- for 400 containers of Orange to be exported to Afghanistan and Central Asia. However, the Government of Pakistan's regulation to maintain a temperature of 4°C during transportation has significantly increased costs. Previously, transporting a container cost four lakh rupees, but with the new temperature requirement, the cost has doubled to eight lakh rupees. This increase in cost has severely impacted the export of Oranges, effectively halting it.
- Following this, the issue of tomato exports arose. Pakistan did not allow the export of tomatoes, which led to significant financial losses for small businessmen, leaving them indebted. In some cases, tomatoes were even discarded from the mountains of Torkham due to the inability to export them to Afghanistan. These losses were a direct result of the Pakistani government's decision to halt tomato exports at the border. This restriction prevented traders from delivering their produce to Afghanistan. If such issues continue to disrupt trade between Pakistan & Afghanistan, it will become increasingly difficult for Pakistan to maintain trade relations with Afghanistan.

6.4.2. Border Closures and Transit Route Distance

- Afghanistan is a neighboring country of Pakistan, yet Pakistan has not fully benefited from trade with Afghanistan, unlike other neighboring and non-neighboring countries. This is despite Pakistan's geographical advantage of being closer to Afghanistan than any other country. For example, a truck leaving from Khyber Pakhtunkhwa can reach Afghanistan within 12 to 16 hours.
- Bilateral trade between Pakistan and Afghanistan was once better, with Pakistan exporting 80 percent and importing 20 percent. Pakistan has the capacity to supply everything from value added goods to small necessities. However, Pakistan has not fully capitalized on this opportunity. In 2012, Pakistan's exports to Afghanistan reached around 1.5 billion dollars, but they have declined since then.
- Despite being neighbors and having a history of conflict, Pakistan has never stopped trading with India, even during times of war. However, frequent closures of the Pakistan-Afghanistan border, affecting both pedestrian movement and trade, have disrupted business. Since the border is the only trade route, any closure directly impacts trade.
- In the private sector, businesses rely on mutual trust to place orders and deliver goods. If trade is disrupted, the government does not compensate for losses, leaving businessmen to bear the financial burden. This has led to frustration among Afghan traders, who have increasingly turned to other countries for their trade needs, further damaging Pakistan's trade relations with Afghanistan.
- Currently, Pakistan exports goods such as meat, poultry, and eggs to Afghanistan, including frozen meat. However, a new challenge has emerged in Pakistan-Afghanistan trade due to the KP government's imposition of a two percent Infrastructure Development CESS (IDC) which has negatively impacted exports. Additionally, import transit has also become increasingly difficult, leading many traders to use Iranian ports instead of Torkham and Chaman.
- One major issue is the lack of regulation for shipping lines based in Karachi, allowing them to set arbitrary rates. Complications related to examination, bonded carriers, and truck availability result in containers spending 14 to 15 days at Karachi port, increasing freight costs. Rent is charged until containers are returned, with some charging \$100 to \$120 per day, leading to significant expenses.
- In contrast, transit through Iran involves fewer charges, although freight rates are slightly higher. The journey takes 20 to 22 days, as goods first go to Herat before reaching Kabul, taking about seven to eight days within Afghanistan. Despite this longer route, traders prefer it due to lower costs. If Pakistan's Afghan transit route is improved, Karachi would provide the shortest and fastest route, revitalizing transit trade through Pakistan.

6.4.3. Need for Proper Foreign Currency Settlement Mechanism

- To improve bilateral trade between Pakistan and Afghanistan, the first step is to establish a proper banking channel, as currently, no formal banking system exists for trade transactions. Instead, informal currency exchanges are taking place at the Torkham border, where around 8 to 10 currency dealers operate.
- Traders bring dollars into Pakistan, which are then handed over to these dealers, who send the dollars back to Afghanistan. The same dollars are then recirculated for future trade transactions, resulting in no fresh inflow of foreign currency into Pakistan. This issue highlights the need for the government to review and revise its policies to formalize trade payments and ensure the inflow of new dollars.

6.4.4. Logistics Problems at the Border

- In Afghanistan, there have been notable changes in governance compared to the past. Under the new regime, many issues have been significantly reduced, leading to improvements in several areas. For instance, operations are now more transparent, speed money practices have declined, and regulations are clearly defined. Previously, freight operations at the Afghan side of Torkham were monopolized by transporters, but the current government monitors everything more strictly. Additionally, a one-window solution for services has been implemented, with most non-commercial shipments going to Kabul and commercial shipments to Jalalabad.
- However, despite these improvements, political relations between Pakistan and Afghanistan remain strained. For example, during the pomegranate season, Pakistan increased tariffs, causing significant losses to Afghan producers. Although Afghanistan prefers trading with Pakistan over Iran, inconsistent policies from Pakistan have hindered this potential.
- Currently, one of the biggest challenges is the 2% IDC imposed by the KP government, affecting both exports and imports. Another pressing issue is the limited space for shipments at the border. Containers from different provinces arrive at the border and face long delays due to space constraints. This congestion completely halts port operations, leading to significant delays, especially for perishable goods, resulting in heavy financial losses for traders.

6.4.5. Clearance Delays at the Border

- Currently, the Ministry of Commerce has allowed the export of many items in Pakistani rupees. However, there is no
 clear mechanism for how these rupees will return to Pakistan once they go out, raising concerns about payment
 settlements.
- Under the Afghan Taliban regime, trade support has been limited. For instance, Pakistan began importing coal from Afghanistan when no other country was willing to buy it. However, Afghanistan imposed an export duty of 20,000 rupees per ton on coal and charged in dollars. Such high export duties and tariffs negatively impact trade between Pakistan and Afghanistan.
- At the Torkham border, it is not just customs that regulate trade; multiple agencies, including the security agencies, are involved. These agencies operate with the mindset that for every one truck entering Pakistan, one must exit. Even after clearing customs and completing all formalities, security agencies conduct additional checks, causing delays and negatively impacting trade efficiency.

6.4.6. Political and Bureaucratic Inefficiency

- Pakistan's exports to Afghanistan have significantly decreased, largely due to the imposition of a 2% IDC. This charge amounts to about Rs.400,000 500,000 per truck, with around 400 to 500 trucks crossing the border daily. The revenue generated from IDC on these trucks thus reaches billions of rupees. During a meeting with Customs, it was suggested that the tax should be imposed on a per truck basis rather than on the value of the commodity.
- Another major issue is the lack of a banking system in Afghanistan, leading to trade through a barter system where goods are exchanged instead of currency.
- It was reported by Pakistani traders that Afghanistan's Customs department imposes higher duties on Pakistani goods compared to imports from Iran or other countries. For example, a truck from Pakistan is charged Rs.500,000/- in tax, while a truck from Iran is charged only Rs.200,000/-. This discriminatory policy creates a competitive disadvantage for Pakistani exporters.
- Political conflicts between Pakistan and Afghanistan further complicate trade relations. For instance, during the grape season, Pakistan increased tariffs by 15%, leading to significant losses for Afghan farmers as their products went to waste. In retaliation, Afghanistan raised tariffs on Pakistani products. These ongoing political tensions continue to harm traders, producers, and farmers on both sides. Improving political relations, Customs system, and law and order would not only enhance bilateral trade but also open access to Central Asian markets, reducing Pakistan's dependence on other countries for exports.

6.4.7. Carpet Exporters

- During a meeting with the Ministry of Commerce, it was highlighted that carpets are being smuggled despite Pakistan benefiting from legitimate exports. It was suggested that reducing the duty on carpets would encourage legal imports, boost revenue, and bring in foreign exchange. However, instead of reducing the duty, the Ministry proposed lowering the Import Trade Price (ITP). Initially, a duty of 100 rupees per meter was imposed, which increased the cost to about four and a half lakhs per shipment. As a result, carpet imports surged, creating a boom in the market.
- However, the ITP gradually increased to about eight dollars per meter, significantly raising the cost of entire shipment. This high ITP has made it difficult for Pakistan to compete with India in the international market. Currently, about 150,000 square meters of carpets are stuck in Afghanistan because the high ITP makes importing them to Pakistan unfeasible, negatively impacting the carpet trade between the two countries.
- Additionally, the KP government imposed a 2% Infrastructure Development CESS (IDC) on all exports including those on carpet imports. The IDC has significantly increased costs, making it difficult to export or import profitably. As a result, Pakistan's high tax policies have strained trade relationships, with the carpet trade being particularly affected, leading to a sharp decline in this sector. Therefore, it has been requested that the Ministry of commerce and customs officials reduce the ITP, withholding tax, 2% CESS to revive the trade.

6.4.8. Meat Exporters

- Beef exports to Afghanistan began in 2004. Before this, most beef was smuggled, but once the formal sector entered the market, smuggling declined, traders started selling chilled meat as there is a market for fresh meat in Afghanistan. However, local delays, police demand for speed money, and border holdups have negatively impact trade. The exporters of meat primarily focus on perishable items, including chicken and beef, as well as live broilers, which they export to Afghanistan. Afghans demand everything from basic goods to high-quality products, and Pakistan has the potential to fulfill their needs through exports. However, frequent border issues disrupt trade. Once, due to a minor clash between Afghanistan and Pakistan, the border was closed, and export trucks remained parked for 14 days.
- In another instance, a court case led to an order halting meat export to Afghanistan after a judge was misinformed that exports were causing local price hikes. The ban lasted three months, financially ruining many traders. Later, a food secretary admitted the mistake and allowed exports to resume, but by then, Pakistan had lost a lucrative market as Afghan importers had started sourcing meat from other countries.

6.5 Challenges in Bilateral Trade

Pakistan has a strong potential for exporting commodities highlighted in this report, however, there are a number of challenges faced in expanding trade ties with Afghanistan. Some of these are:

6.5.1 Transportation:

- Inadequate Infrastructure: Poor road networks, damaged transportation routes, and a lack of modern logistics facilities hinder the smooth flow of goods between Pakistan and Afghanistan, increasing transit times and costs.
- Customs and Border Delays: Lengthy Customs procedures, inadequate border management, and inconsistent
 policies at key checkpoints like Torkham and Chaman disrupt trade and lead to inefficiencies.
- **Security Concerns:** Political instability, security threats, and the risk of goods theft or damage in transit pose significant challenges to safe and reliable transportation between the two countries.

6.5.2 Challenges Faced in the Afghanistan Market:

- Political Instability: Frequent changes in government policies and ongoing conflicts create an uncertain business environment.
- Weak Infrastructure: Inadequate transportation, warehousing, and communication networks hinder trade efficiency.
- Security Concerns: Persistent security threats, including insurgencies and criminal activities, pose significant risks for traders
- Regulatory Barriers: Complex and inconsistent trade regulations, coupled with a lack of transparency, delay processes
 and increase costs.

- Currency and Payment Issues: Limited access to formal banking channels and challenges with currency exchange complicate transactions.
- Pakistani Exporters faced payment issue in the Afghan Market: One of the major challenges faced by Pakistani exporters in the Afghan market is the restriction on the amount of money an individual can bring back to Pakistan. Currently, an exporter is allowed to bring only \$5,000 USD per person. This creates a significant issue for businesses dealing in large transactions.
- For example, if an exporter sends a truckload of goods worth \$100,000 USD, they would need to arrange 20 individuals to bring the full amount back to Pakistan. Since a single person cannot carry more than \$5,000 USD, this regulation creates logistical difficulties, increases operational costs, and poses serious constraints on trade. Addressing this issue is crucial for facilitating smoother cross-border trade and improving export efficiency for Pakistani businesses.
- Dependence on Informal Trade Networks: Heavy reliance on informal trade channels leads to unregulated and unpredictable market dynamics.
- Competition from Regional Players: Strong competition from countries like Iran, India, and China reduces the market share available to other traders.
- High Logistics Costs: Transportation and trade costs are elevated due to poor infrastructure and security concerns.

6.5.3 Issues Faced by Pakistani Exporters in Pakistan

- Frequent Border Closures: Unpredictable border shutdowns disrupt the movement of goods, causing delays and financial losses.
- High Infrastructure Development CESS (IDC) The 2% IDC imposed by the Pakistani government increase costs, reducing export competitiveness.
- Infrastructure Constraints at Border: Limited customs facilities, inadequate warehousing, and inefficient border processes cause logistical delays.
- Security Concerns: The volatile security situation near border areas discourages exporters and raises transportation
 costs.
- Bureaucratic Delays: Inefficiencies in government departments cause delays in processing export permits and other approvals.
- Limited Access to Finance: Many exporters struggle to secure affordable credit and financing options for scaling operations.
- Unfavorable Payment Channels: Limited formal banking channels between Pakistan and Afghanistan lead to reliance on informal systems like hawala, increasing financial risks.
- Tax and Regulatory Challenges: Frequent changes in tax policies and inconsistent regulatory frameworks create uncertainty for exporters.
- Non-Tariff Barriers: Lengthy inspections, frequent policy changes, and unclear trade regulations create hurdles for exporters.



Chapter: 7

Policy Recommendations

Policy Recommendations for Enhancing Pakistan Afghanistan Bilateral Trade

7.1 Enhance Bilateral Trade Relations and Agreements

Pakistan needs to prioritize enhancing bilateral trade with Afghanistan in order to solidify its position as Afghanistan's top trading partner. By renegotiating or expanding existing trade agreements, Pakistan can secure favorable terms for its exports and incentivize Afghan importers to choose Pakistani goods over competitors from border and non-border countries like Iran, Kazakhstan, Uzbekistan, China, India, Türkiye and UAE.

7.2 Need to Focus on Product Diversification and Competitive Pricing

The data highlights that Afghanistan relies heavily on imports of key commodities such as wheat, palm oil, Medicaments consisting of mixed or unmixed products for therapeutic or prophylactic purposes, Portland cement etc.

Pakistan should enhance its export portfolio by focusing on high-demand products such as wheat, palm oil / cooking oil, medicaments, textiles, and lead-acid accumulators to increase its market share in Afghanistan. Adopting competitive pricing strategies will help Pakistani exporters remain cost-effective against regional competitors. Additionally, the government should streamline export procedures, reduce trade barriers, and establish favorable trade agreements to facilitate smoother cross-border trade. Investments in logistics, transportation, and border infrastructure will further reduce costs and delivery times, making Pakistani exports more attractive.

7.3 Infrastructure Development for Trade Facilitation

Improved border infrastructure is critical to facilitating faster and more efficient trade between Pakistan and Afghanistan. Enhancing trade routes such as the Kamar-din (Located in Zhob District), Torkham and Chaman borders with modern customs procedures, warehousing facilities, and transportation networks will reduce delays and costs, making Pakistani goods more competitive.

7.4 Establish Special Economic Zones (SEZs) and Warehousing Facilities Near Borders

Setting up SEZs near the Afghan border, focused on goods in high demand in Afghanistan, can significantly boost exports. These zones can provide Afghan traders with ready access to Pakistani goods and encourage joint ventures between Pakistani and Afghan businesses.

7.5 Promote Trade with Central Asia via Afghanistan

Given Afghanistan's strategic location as a gateway to Central Asia, Pakistan should leverage its trade relations with Afghanistan to enhance its access to Central Asian markets. Developing transport corridors under initiatives like the CAREC (Central Asia Regional Economic Cooperation) program can improve regional connectivity and open up new trade opportunities.

7.6 Address Non-Tariff Barriers (NTBs) and Facilitate Ease of Doing Business

To enhance its competitiveness, Pakistan must address non-tariff barriers, such as cumbersome Customs procedures (These procedures often involve excessive paperwork, long approval times, unclear regulations, and inconsistent enforcement) and regulatory hurdles. Simplifying trade documentation and reducing bureaucratic inefficiencies will encourage Afghan importers to source more products from Pakistan.

7.7 High Infrastructure Development CESS (IDC)

The KP government should reduce or eliminate the 2% IDC on exports to Afghanistan and beyond to lower costs and enhance export competitiveness. Alternatively, targeted subsidies or tax rebates could offset the financial burden on exporters. Exempting key goods like food, pharmaceuticals, and construction materials from IDC would further encourage trade. Additionally, fostering regional trade agreements and involving exporters in policy discussions can help create a more favorable and competitive trade environment.

7.8 Quality Assurance and Branding for Key Exports

Pakistan should focus on improving the quality and branding of its exports, particularly in categories like food preparations, wheat, and pharmaceuticals. Establishing Pakistan as a reliable source of high-quality goods will build trust among Afghan consumers and businesses, further cementing its position in the Afghan market.

7.9 Financial Incentives and Export Financing

To boost exports, Pakistan can introduce financial incentives such as export subsidies for high-demand goods in Afghanistan. Additionally, export financing mechanisms can support Pakistani exporters by reducing their financial risks, encouraging them to explore new markets within Afghanistan and beyond.

7.10 More Formal Payment Channels

To overcome the challenge of limited formal banking channels between Pakistan and Afghanistan, the government should focus on establishing direct banking linkages through bilateral agreements and promoting the use of digital payment platforms for cross-border trade. Encouraging banks to open correspondent accounts and offering incentives for financial institutions to operate in the region can help reduce reliance on informal systems like hawala.

7.11 Strengthen Trade Diplomacy and Stakeholder Engagement

Pakistan should invest in trade diplomacy by engaging Afghan policymakers and business leaders. Regular trade forums, expos, and business-to-business (B2B) meetings can help strengthen economic ties and promote Pakistani products in Afghanistan.
