

1.0 Preamble

This study is purely theoretical in that it is modelled after the "maximum possible potential approach" and looks at areas where both Pakistan and India should most likely trade given their production capabilities. It uses "revealed comparative advantage" and "potential exports theories" to indicate product lines where trade –theoretically would be optimum and where the two countries could consider giving concessional treatment to one another.

In the short run, India stands to benefit more given its larger economies of scale and Pakistan's consumption patterns. However, the theoretical nature of this model does not take into account the long drawn out history of strained and intermittent trade relations between the two countries, marred by factors that have been at times, critically dependent on issues beyond trade. The persistent political frictions, and disturbances at the border, among others have prevented the development of a normal trading regime between the two most important economies in South Asia.

Both countries tend to adopt extreme caution whilst trading with each other which frequently limits and in some cases discourages trade. Mercantilism and narrow nationalism at times tends to restrict cross border cooperation and integration of value chains something which is important for South Asia to develop into a manufacturing and consumption hub of the 21st Century.

TheAuthors request caution in using their findings in the area of policy discourse as the impact of the elaborate network of trade defence mechanisms which both countries have put in place might not allow the maximum benefits of trade to materialize. Trade can only normalize between Pakistan and India when both countries are able to resolve the reported Tariff, Para tariff andNon-Tariff Barriers existing on both sides of the border

2.0 Key Findings

2.1 Actual vs. Potential Trade

India granted MFN status to Pakistan in 1996 and under the SAFTA agreement¹ Pakistan is able to export to India at basic duty rates of 5% and 8%. However, exports to India remain less than 10% of their bilateral trade potential of nearly 3.6 billion dollars².

Bilateral trade between Pakistan and India was valued 1.9 billion dollars in 2012 which was 2.8% of Pakistan's total trade with the world. India's total trade value in 2012 was almost 780 billion dollars making the share of Pak-India bilateral trade almost insignificant from India's perspective. Sri Lanka which faces the same SAFTA sensitive list from India as Pakistan, has a bilateral trade with India valued at 4.1 billion dollars.

This study estimates total potential bilateral trade of 18 billion dollars, of which 3.6 billion dollars is the export potential of Pakistan. Only 0.4 billion dollars of the total export potential of Pakistan accounts for items in India's sensitive list. Majority itemsare not part of the India's sensitive list, have huge potential for exports to India but have still recorded negligible volumes of exportover the years. This would seem to indicate that tariffs and perceived or actual Non-Tariff Barriers (NTB) may have played a key role in restricting growth in exports to India.

Some of the items in which Pakistan has done well in exports to the World and where India is a net importer are shown below. These items are not part of India's Sensitive List for Pakistan's exports.

2.2 Barriers to bilateral trade

2.2.1 Sensitive and Negative Lists

Pakistan and India both reduced their sensitive lists under the SAFTA Agreement in 2011. Pakistan reduced its Sensitive List to 936 (reduced by 19%) and India to 614 (reduced by 30%). Pakistan also replaced its positive list of 1934 items with a negative list of 1209 items in early 2012. In the September 2012 meeting of the Ministers of Commerce of the two countries, both sides promised to further make concessions: India to bring down its sensitive list to 100 items and Pakistan to grant MFN status and open up the Wagah-Attari border for import of all items. Currently, Pakistan allows only 137 items to move via the land route.

Pakistan's negative list is comprised of items which Pakistan does not allow to be imported from India. India frequently cites the Negative List along with restrictions at the land border crossing as the largest barrier in exporting goods to Pakistan. Pakistan through the Negative List protects agricultural products such as fruit, wheat, rice, sugar, tea and milk products while the negative list for industrial products protects items in textile and clothing, electronics, vehicle and auto parts, iron and steel and cosmetics. India through its Sensitive List mostly protects its textile and agricultural sectors. Others sectors which are protected include rubber, plastics and paper products.

2.2.2 Para-tariff measures

India's Para-tariffs are a major challenge to the trade normalization process between the two countries primiarily because of the marked difference in how tariffs are applied in both countries. Items that are not protected by India under its sensitive list such as Jewellery face a basic tariff of 5% but duties paid by importers can be as high as 23% because of high levels of Para-tariffs. Some items in India's sensitive list can face tariffs as high as 164% (for instance ethyl alcohol). These Para-tariffs include Countervailing Duty (CVD), Education Cess, Secondary and Higher Education Cess (SAH)which are also applicable on locally manufactured products. However, it applies a Special Countervailing Duty on imported products. This significantly increases the total applied tariffs for imports. More concerning is the apparent disparity of these para-tariffs on local production versus imports.

India's tariffs are structured in a manner that at an MFN rate of 5%, an exporter would pay 23% total tariff, while a local producer would pay 12% levies giving a 11% leeway for the local product rather than the permitted 5%.

Para-tariffs in Pakistan are relatively low. Petroleum Oils⁴, which has the highest import potential for India faces only 6.6% Para-tariff. GST that has the highest chunk of Para-tariffs in Pakistan is exempt for imports of food, raw materials, and capital goods. Once SAFTA duty comes into play, duty on imports from Pakistan will continue to be 11% higher than levies on local Indian production while the same will be 5% higher on Indian imports into Pakistan.

The table below shows some high potential exports to India with India's Tariff and Para-tariff structure.

2.2.3 Non-tariff barriers

The tariff and Para-tariff measures imposed by India have shown to make Pakistani products uncompetitive in the Indian market but it is the Non -tariff barriers (NTBs) that appear to pose the real hurdle. The government of India insists that NTBs imposed on Pakistan's exports are not specific to Pakistan. It asserts that quality regulations and sanitary laws are to protect India's consumers whereas non-technical barriers to trade such as Para-tariffs are for the protection of its industries⁵. However, exporters from Pakistan contend that many barriers to trade with India are known to be discriminatory for products coming in from Pakistan. This is especially important for Pakistan as some of the products of Pakistan's export interest i.e. agriculture and textiles face some of the toughest NTBs. Indian exporters do not face such difficulties in accessing the Pakistani market leading to inequitable means for market access.

Some NTBs exist because of inefficient trading practices and could be easily removed if the two

countries mutually facilitate and invest in areas such as transportation, infrastructure, border provisions and trade facilitation technology.

On the other hand, a series of reported NTBs affect any substantial growth in trade because of India's trade restrictiveness. These include: strict customs procedures and SPS measures, restrictions on routes and mode of transportation of goods, prohibition on transit trade, a restrictive visa regime and barriers in banking channels.

On the Pakistan side, transportation of goods via the Wagah land route is a major reported NTB as Pakistanallows only 137 items to be imported from India.

It is important to note that limited trade may also be due to the general perception of traders on either side of the border that officials across the border are prone to adopt an extra vigilant and discriminatory approach when dealing with consignments which originate from across the border.

As a consequence of the increasing level of difficulty in trade between the two countries, a significant chunk of trade takes the form of informal trade via indirect third-country routes or smuggling. Estimates suggest this trade is almost as high as formal trade between India and Pakistan. If potential estimates took into account the existing informal trade between the two countries, normalized bilateral trade could potentially grow manifold.

3.0 Recommendations

The long-term goal for Pakistan and India should be to optimize on the opportunities that the two countries enjoy because of their geographic proximity. India's role in the trade normalization process is critical. Whereas Pakistan only has to taper down its level of protection in terms of either the negative and / or the sensitive listwhile opening up its land borders, it is the strategic NTBs placed by India that are perceived as the major impediment to a substantial growth in bilateral trade.

Recently both countries have shown interest in liberalizing trade. Efforts have been made to increase dialogue between the governments and the business communities of the two countries leading to some encouraging developments:

- a) As a means to overcoming India's NTB, the two countries signed the following three agreements in September of 2012.
 - i) Cooperation and Mutual Assistance in Customs Matters.
 - ii) Bilateral Cooperation Agreement between BIS (Bureau of Indian Standards).
 - iii) PSQCA (Pakistan Standards & Quality Control Authority) and Agreement on the Redressal of Trade Grievances.

However, these three agreements are still to be formally implemented.

- b) Agreement to replace the term Most Favoured Nation (MFN) with a more acceptable termNon-Discriminatory Market Access (NDMA).
- c) The two countries have agreed in principle toopen the Wagah Border for 24 hours, 7 days a week in January of 2014, though this too needs to be implemented.
- d) The two countries have promised to allow three banks to open branches across the borders.

Recommendations made in this study outline a roadmap for strategic negotiations between Pakistan and India that could substantially increase trade in the short term by possibly diverting trade and in the long term by identifying areas for increased investments.

3.1 Negotiating along select product lines and concessional treatment

Once MFN is granted and Pakistan's negative list is no longer operative, both the countries will move to SAFTA Sensitive lists which is planned to be pruned down substantially over the next 5 years. Pakistan and India need to steer the conversation toward maximizing their potential trade and offering preferential concessions along items that would benefit them most. India's additional duties and NTBs challenge the notion of reciprocal treatment and must be subject to negotiation.

Our calculations of potential trade between Pakistan and India (using the Indicative Potential Trade approach and Revealed Comparative Advantage approach) help us to conclude the following:

- i) Pakistan can potentially export another 3.6 billion dollars worth of products to India
- ii) There are 758 items in which India holds high potential to export to Pakistan.

3.1.1 Most Exportable Items to India:

Pakistan can potentially export another 3.6 billion dollars' worth of products to India. Interestingly, the major exportable items to India are not part of India's SAFTA Sensitive List. In fact, there are merely 109 items (potential export of 0.4 billion dollars) which are on India's protection list that Pakistan has a comparative advantage to export. **This confirms the assertion that if India prunes its sensitive list**

down to 100 items, but fails to address the critical issue of sector specific non-tariff barriers and its para-tariffs, Pakistan will not be able to significantly increase its exports to the Indian market even along products that are not currently protected by India's SAFTA Sensitive List.

The Authors recommend that Pakistan should seek preferential treatment from India along 419 highlighted items in this study where Pakistan has high capacity to produce /exportto India. (Annexure A). This preferential treatment should extend to SAFTA tariff concessions, plus concessionary treatment in levying of Para-tariff measures as well as a liberalized Non-Tariff Barrier regime from India. 109 items of these 419 are part of India's current SAFTA Sensitive List and Pakistan must negotiate the removal of these items.

3.1.2 Most Importable Items from India:

Authors have identified 758 items (Annexure B) that India holds high potential to export to Pakistan. Majority of these items lie in the Chemicals, Base Metal and Machinery sectors and total potential is estimated to be 14.2 billion dollars. India can seek preferential treatment from Pakistan along these 758 items. It is also worth pointing out that nearly 59% of India's potential to export to Pakistan comprises of Petroleum and fuel products. These items however are currently not allowed to be imported through the Wagah-Attari border.

Our calculations of indicative potential trade takes into account a country's imports from the world. Since Pakistan is importing these items from other countries, it would be logistically easier for Pakistan to import from India. It would largely benefit Pakistan to import items that Pakistan does not produce indigenously or other input items that would enable Pakistan to produce value added products incountry. This would include machinery products that are otherwise imported from countries at higher transaction costs. Given India's reciprocal cooperation in reducing its non-tariff barriers and para tariff measures for Pakistan, bilateral trade has the potential to lead to a win-win situation for both countries.

261 of the 758 items which have a high export potential for India are currently in Pakistan's SAFTA Sensitive List. In addition, only 3 of these items are currently allowed to be traded through the Wagah land border. Thus, even if Pakistan was to give India NDMA status and the SAFTA sensitive list was put in place, restriction on trade through Wagah would continue to be a major impediment to Indian exports to Pakistan.

Though theoretically these items should ideally be removed from the protection lists of Pakistan, when it will actually happen is dependent on the on-going negotiations between the sectors likely to be affected and the Government of Pakistan.

The table below shows the likely impact of import liberalization by Pakistan for Indian products with most export potential from the Indian side.

3.2 Addressing the issue of Non-Tariff Barriers (NTBs)

Several Non-Tariff Barriers maintained by India that need to be immediately addressed to reassure Pakistani exporters of their ability to tap into the Indian markets. Though an effort has been made through the signing of Cooperation and Mutual Assistance in Customs Matters, Bilateral Cooperation Agreement between BIS (Bureau of Indian Standards) and PSQCA (Pakistan Standards & Quality Control Authority) and an Agreement on the Redressal of Trade Grievances, these are yet to be made operational to gaudge their likely impact. The specific areas where the two countries need to work on are:

3.2.1 Streamlining custom procedures and technical support

Custom inefficiencies such as lack of tracking and tracing facilities of goods sent across the borders, unscheduled time lags in goods sent via sea, and low quality of logistics have been identified as major barriers to smooth trade between Pakistan and India. Electronic Data Interchange facilities (EDI) have been suggested as a means to immediately fasten processes. Rules, regulations, specific requirements and trade regimes need to be formally communicated on a timely basis where custom officials across borders should be front line managers to handle any disputes or inconsistencies. Pakistani exporters need to be educated to understand the regulatory regime and standard requirements in India while India must facilitate Pakistani exporters in the long and cumbersome procedures of licensing and certification of products by prompt processing and response.

Transparency in Customs procedures is essential so that they do not appear to have been arbitrarily applied; anychangesin Customs procedures must be notified immediately. Many times, HS code classification is different for products in Pakistan and India especially for products in the sensitive and negative lists. Such is then resolved through the discretionary powers of the custom officials and many time affect duty rates. A refined custom manual should be able to provide traders with guidelines to a more harmonized system.

3.2.2 Transport and transit facilitation

The advantage of shared borders is largely forgone in trade between India and Pakistan due to the many limitations surrounding transportation. Many routes that could be opened via land remain closed, the current operational routes are not integrated and developed enough to cater to large shipments, borders are open for limited period of time in the day and clearances are slow and cumbersome. In order to minimize overall costs, time delays and the increasing level of informal trade, the two countries must work together to develop better infrastructure for transport. Routes and medium of transport (road, rail, sea, and air) should be optimized by opening up borders at all hours, warehousing facilities must be provided on both sides and restrictions on type and quantity of goods should be immediately removed. A more efficient and responsive system of custom procedures must be established to cater to the security and viability of moving goods across borders.

3.2.3 Financial facilitation

Trade is hampered because of many operational barriers that exist in the banking channels between Pakistan and India. Traders need to be provided with financial facilitation in both countries to ensure smooth execution of trade transactions with minimum payment delays. Banking instruments need to be moulded to cope with the short transaction time for goods moving via land borders. The current facility allows payment receipts in 7 days whereas goods can be transported in a few hours. If goods are reaching across the border within a matter of hours, it is crucial to establish faster, more transparent methods. As a start, 24 hour banking facility should be initiated to meet standard operating procedures and meet requirements within minimum time. Pakistani banks need to open their branches in India and vice versa. Pakistan has already given NOCs to Indian banks to open their branches in Pakistan

but such has not been reciprocated by the Indian side. In theory, all banks that are willing to operate across the border should be allowed to do so. This also has to go hand in hand with a more relaxed visa regime. An alternate to opening branches across the borders is to have representative offices across the borders that facilitate in the trade process with appropriate communication channels and timely information exchange.

3.2.4 Liberalizing the visa regime

The visa agreement signed in September of 2012 offers provision for a multiple entry visa, single entry visa via Wagah Attari and tourist visa for no less than 10 days. Immediate measures need to be taken to further enhance this agreement to make the process of visa application more streamlined with reduced control mechanisms. An alternative to police reporting for genuine businesspeople needs to be explored. Special visa facilitation needs to be provided for businessmen, trainers, technical and business experts and academics. A liberalized visa regime would allow for faster, more transparent visa processing, additionally there should be no restrictions on entry/exit, multiple entry and city specific visa, allowing for longer stays.

3.2.5 Changing the bureaucratic mind-sets

The tone from the top dictates all levels of communication. While trust deficit persists in the general public and trade stakeholders in both Pakistan and India, such can be eliminated with the help of governments and opinion leaders / officials at the highest levels by projecting positive and trade enhancing messages. Broadcast, print and social media should be strategically used for this purpose. Officials and trade authority figures should be instructed to adhere to the defined guidelines. Where discretionary decisions must be employed, a dispute resolution mechanism that is uniform and transparent across all cities and sectors of trade should be able to provide a guideline to avoid any unpleasant incident.

3.2.6 Strengthening channels of communication

Gaps in communication and information sharing has also proved to be a barrier to trade but can be mutually and immediately addressed. Mobile networks and roaming telephones services should be allowed. Custom to custom contact should be facilitated across the borders. A one-stop shop online portal should be set up with updated information on duty structures, concessions, rules, regulations and procedures that are specific to products and sectors. Customs and banking channels should provide comprehensive manuals to all traders and officials. Information needs to be streamlined and communicated on a timely basis.

Procedure standardization and institutionalization of systems is the key within and across borders. A lot of effort would be saved if both countries agreed upon a simplified and transparent dispute settlement mechanism that would address all issues pertaining to trade facilitation and communication.

3.2.7 Facilitating trade via increased business to business contacts

In 2012 it was agreed by the Ministers of Commerce of India and Pakistan to setup a Joint Business Forum comprising of 15 leading businessmen each from both countries. The objective behind the formation of this Joint Business Forum was to allow the business representatives from both countries to identify the issues that have delayed trade normalization between the two countries and make recommendations to their respective governments on policy matters to facilitate a liberalized trade. The Pakistan India Joint Business Forum (PIJBF) was notified and Joint Taskforces in sectors such as textiles, automobiles, energy, education, agriculture, pharmaceutical, banking and SMEs have been formed to debate and come up with recommendations aimed at early normalization of trade. The PBC along with CII (Confederation of Indian Industry) are the secretariats for the PIJBF.

3.2.8 Protecting the local industry

While the SAFTA agreement allows countries to maintain sensitive lists, tariff based protection will always offer an inadequate level of safeguard for the Pakistani manufacturers. At MFN rates with no other tariff or non-tariff restrictions put it in by Pakistan; India's goods will most always be cheaper. With subsidies almost 3% of GDP, India budgeted 40 billion dollar⁶ worth of subsidies (see details in Table 5) in 2013-14. Majority of these are food (39%), fertilizer (29%), power (28%) and other subsidies including export (4%). Studies conducted in India suggest significant levels of hidden subsidies other than the ones currently estimated⁷. Subsidized products in India in agriculture and industry both significantly lower input costs. Goods being imported from Indiaare subsequently cheaper compared to the local producer who becomes uncompetitive in the Pakistani market.

Additionally, India enjoys large economies of scale in most of its industries as compared to Pakistan and for many products especially in sectors such as automobile, Pakistani products do not have the same economies of scale and will likely not develop unless large investments are made to boost these sectors. Once MFN is granted and the negative list is removed, Pakistan has also committed to bring down its sensitive list to 100 itemsin the next five years and thus, will be unable to use tariff based measures to protect the interests of all its local producers.

Evidently, tariff protection and barring of imports cannot be Pakistan's long term trade strategy. If importers find Indian products cheaper, they would channel their resources to bringing them via illegal and indirect routes and informal trade would inevitably increase. The Government of Pakistan should now steer its focus toward setting up trade defence mechanisms and strengthening its local regulatory bodies such as the National Tariff Commission (NTC) that can build suitable safeguard measures that would facilitate, empower and protect the local industries and give them impetus to not only become self-sufficient but also increase their market competitiveness. Such should be done in close collaboration with and support from key business stakeholders in Pakistan.

4.0 Study Objectives

Despite signing of the SAFTA agreement, bilateral trade between India and Pakistan remains low compared to trade with their other regional trading partners. Additionally, there is a continued increase in informal and circular trade between the two countries that according to some estimates is as large as the formal trade.

The objective of this study is to estimate the potential for bilateral trade between Pakistan and India and to identify:

- a) A list of items that are most exportable to India by Pakistan
- b) A list of items that are most importable from India by Pakistan

Sources of Data

This study uses secondary data on Trade and Tariff from the United Nations International Trade Centre's (UNITC) and World Integrated Trade Solution (WITS) database published by the World Bank for the period ended 2012 (unless otherwise stated). India's Para-tariffs have been calculated by the Authors and rechecked from the Indian Customs portal.

For consistency in results, we have used data reported by Pakistan for imports and exports throughout the analysis.

Primary data for this study has been obtained through participation in meetings of the various taskforces of the Pakistan India Joint Business Forum (PIJBF) and informally inferencing the major stakeholders in government and private sectors in Pakistan.

Methodology

We have used a mix of two methods to identify the most exportable and importable items for Pakistan and India:

1) The study first uses the Potential Trade Approach under which an export potential of a trade commodity is defined as minimum of the exporters world export and importers world import, minus the existing trade between the importer's and the exporter's country.

For Pakistan, a potential export item is Min (PWE, IWI) - PEI where PWE, IWI and PEI are Pakistan's World Export, India's World Import and Pakistan's Export to India.

2) After identifying the high potential items, we calculated Revealed Comparative Advantage (RCA) of these products. The RCA⁸ is an index used for calculating the relative advantage or disadvantage of a certain country in a certain class of goods or services as evidenced by trade flows. RCA is essentially a static concept that ignores several dynamic factors when comparing trading partners. Nonetheless, it is a crucial measure used in international economics and gives a broad view of the advantage that one country holds over the other.

The original RCA Index is formulated by Balassa (1965) can be written as

RCA= (Xij/Xtj) / (Xin/ Xtn), where X represents exports, i Is country, j is a commodity, t is a set of commodities and n is a set of countries. We will use world exports as our set of countries in our analysis

3) To arrive at optimum estimates, the two approaches have been used in the following way:

Most exportable items to India:

Pakistan's potential export to India > India's potential to export where Pakistan's RCA> 1 and >India's RCA

Most importable items from India:

India's potential export to Pakistan's Pakistan's potential to export where India's RCA>1 and > Pakistan's RCA

5.0 Background to the Study


As talks of trade normalization between the two countries begin to gain momentum, the question of whether Pakistan will grant Most Favoured Nation (MFN) or Non Discriminatory Market Access (NDMA) – the new preferred term for MFN status to India remains unresolved. Negotiations indicate that Pakistan will grant to India in 2014. Pakistan, along with other members of South Asian Association for Regional Cooperation (SAARC) ratified the South Asian Free Trade Area (SAFTA) Agreement in 2006 but the impact of the SAFTA agreement was indeterminate when it came to India and Pakistan because of the pending issue of the MFN status.

Recent meetings of the Pakistan India Joint Business Forum (PIJBF) led by the private sector of the two countries aim to play a pivotal role in trade normalization. The Forum formedsectorial taskforces to identify problems and develop policy recommendations to normalize trade. Despite tensions in the Line of Control, delegates from the two countries have continued to meet and address issues pertaining to trade impediments.

The process of trade normalization has had some successes. The positive list of Pakistan considered by many as excessively protectionist was abolished. Pakistan moved from the positive list (1934 items allowed) in February of 2012 to a negative list (all items allowed except 1209). Furthermore, both countries reduced their sensitive lists (30% by India and 19% by Pakistan) giving SAFTA concessions on these items.

On the other hand, India granted MFN status to Pakistan in 1996. Ten years later, the SAFTA agreement was signed which facilitated Pakistan to export to India at concessional tariffs of 8% and 5%. Given the regional advantages the two countries enjoy, exports to India stood at 348 million dollars in 2012, merely 1.4% of Pakistan world exports of 24.6 billion dollars.

Relative trade shows that Pakistan's share of exports as a percentage of total bilateral trade between the countries, decreased from 2003, remaining below 20% from 2007(Graph 1). However, a 27% growth in exports to India in 2012 is a change in direction of growth raises expectations of further improvement considering the high potential of export to India.


The structure of Para-Tariffs and Non-Tariff Barriers (NTB) has frequently been quoted as the major hindrance in the growth of Pakistan's exports to India. Additionally, high potential export items such as textile, footwear, fans, plastics and marble are protected by India under the SAFTA Sensitive List. This list is expected to be reduced to a 100 items in the next 5 years if Pakistan meets India's demands of opening of Wagah border for all items and hence remains a matter of negotiation.

BACKGROUND

Despite an upsurge in the share of bilateral trade with India in 2012, Pakistan has the lowest level of exports as compared to other SAARC members such as Sri Lanka and Bangladesh. Bangladesh's exports have increased since 2005 and Sri Lanka was a major exporting country to India in 2012. Sri Lanka and Pakistan face similar NTBs and a common SAFTA Sensitive List from India. However, India and Sri Lanka enjoy better bilateral relations since the two countries have signed a Free Trade Agreement (FTA) in 1999 facilitating trade. Additionally, Bangladesh's world exports are 26.1 billion dollars, 1.6 billion dollars higher than Pakistan's but it faces restriction of only 25 tariff lines on India's SAFTA Sensitive List for Least Developed Countries (LDCs) whereas Pakistan faces restriction for 614 tariff lines on India's SAFTA Sensitive List for Non-LDCs (NLDCs).

Given mutually beneficial adjustments in the two countries trade policy with each other, Pakistan and India can trade via multiple routes and modes of transport lowering transportation costs, and bringing down informal trade that is reported to be as high as the current trade between the two countries.



6.0Most Exportable items from Pakistan to India

Under the mixed methodology, we conducted an exercise to estimate Pakistan's potential exports to India. Items of exports to the world with a minimum value of 1 million dollar were considered and the maximum possible exports to India were calculated. Items selected were those where Pakistan has a higher potential to export than India. RCA was calculated for all items and those items were chosen where RCA for Pakistan is greater than 1 in addition to being greater than India. This revealed 419 items at 6-digit HS code (see Annexure A) that have high potential export to India. The potential export value of these items is 3.6 billion dollars¹⁰. Current exports to India along these items area mere 175 million dollars.

Sector wise distribution shows that high potential lies in Textile, Jewellery, Base Metal and Medical Instruments sectors with Jewellery Items claiming the highest potential export value of 1.6 billion dollars. These items with relatively lower tariff structure are currently not being imported by India from Pakistan.

6.1 Removal/ exclusion of items from India's SAFTA Sensitive List

There are 614 items in India's Sensitive List for NLDCs, consisting of mostly 6-digit HS code items, and some 4-digit and 8-digit items. We have reconstructed the list so that we only have 6-digit items. The result of this exercise is 619 6-digit items on the SAFTA Sensitive list. There are 109 items in our list of 419 items with export potential to India which are part of India's current SAFTA Sensitive List. Pakistan should primarily look to negotiate for exclusion of these items from India's sensitive list that will eventually be reduced to 100 items. As per 2012, Pakistan's current export value of these 109 items was 3.22 million dollars whereas potential export value is 411.3 million dollars (a complete list of these items is given in Annexure A). Top items in the list among others are footwear, apparel of cotton and fans.

The Textile sector has 80 items with potential export to India which are also part of India's Sensitive List. These are the items where Pakistan has a higher comparative advantage to export. The current export value as of 2012 is 2.3 million dollars and potential export value is 193.2 million dollars.

These select items are the ones where Pakistan has a greater comparative advantage than India and has higher potential to export than India. Currently, Pakistani exports along these items become more expensive in the presence of para tariff duties applied in addition to MFN and many non-tariff measures enforced by India. Exclusion of items from the SAFTA Sensitive List- as a starting point-would lead to reduction of basic duties on items to 0%-5%. Pakistani products would become cheaper for Indian importers hence trade could potentially divert toward Pakistan.


However, as revealed by data,majority of high potential items for exports to India are not part ofIndia's sensitive list indicating that this should be one of the lesser concerns for Pakistan. In fact, negotiations should focus on long-term relaxation of India's carefully placed non-tariff barriers thantrying tonegotiate favourable tariff regime.

A side- step: Analysis of India's SAFTA Sensitive List

In the on-going negotiations between Pakistan and India, India agreed to bring down its sensitive list by 30% once Pakistan opens the Wagah-Attari border for all items and will further reduce it to 100 items on Pakistan's abolishing of the negative list. Our study identifies 109 high potential items of export to India in India's sensitive list, with potential export of 0.4 billion dollars which is not as significant as one would imagine.

It is however still crucial to look at India's sensitive list on the whole and possiblyanalyse what benefits, if any; Pakistan could hope to gain if India removes significant items from its sensitive list. India currently protects the agricultural, textile (mainly apparel) and plastic sectors.



Current exports to India for items in the sensitive list are 79.7 million dollars whereas India's imports from SAARC are 654.2 million dollars. There is a potential of 1.1 billion dollars of Pakistan's exports to India in the Sensitive List of 614 items. Potential lies along items in agriculture, marble, medical, plastics, cotton, apparel, footwear and machinery but Pakistan does not hold a comparative advantage in many of these items. Of all the items in India's sensitive list, Pakistan holds comparative advantage in only 183 items. Of these, Pakistan has a greater comparative advantage over India along 142 items. Of these, 30 items have almost no potential to export to India narrowing the list down to a select 112 items which have a potential of 0.7 billion dollars.

A sector wise look reveals that Pakistan does not stand to benefit greatly from a simple pruning down of the sensitive list because in many cases, despite potential to export, Pakistan does not hold a comparative advantage. For instance, Tractor exports have a potential of nearly 17 million dollars but Pakistan does not have a comparative advantage along it. Where comparative advantage exists, capacity to produce in larger volumes becomes the issue. Similarly, there are many items with high potential in terms of value whichIndia is exporting to the world in much larger volumes. An example is cotton, not carded or combed where Pakistan has a potential to export to India of about 309 million dollars but India's potential to export to Pakistan is 403 million dollars.

Agricultural items:

India heavily protects the agricultural sector. Pakistan's exports to India in the sector on the whole have dwindled over the years even though India imports a fair chunk from the rest of the world. Whereas potential to export to India exists, a careful evaluation shows that Pakistan has a comparative advantage in only 30 of the items in India's Sensitive List. Items include sesame seeds, honey, wheat, oil seeds, mangoes, turmeric, semi-milled rice, onions, milk powder, rye flour, tobacco and maize. Pakistan holds a greater comparative advantage than India in only 18 of these items, potential exports of which is 9.57 million dollars. Products with high potential are shown in the table below:

Pharmaceutical items:

Data reveals two items of interest in India's sensitive list for Pakistan's exports: Ayurvedic medicines and antibiotics with pencillinic acid with potential of 17 and 15 million dollars respectively. Pakistan could capitalize on these items but in both cases, India holds a greater comparative advantage to export than Pakistan.

Plastics:

India's sensitive list contains 68 products in the Plastics sector where Pakistan holds a comparative advantage along 10 of these product lines. Plastics of polypropylene, floor coverings, sacks and bags and kitchenware made of plastics, PVC belt conveyor are some products where Pakistan has potential. This is one sector where Pakistan could lobby more proactively for the removal of products in India's sensitive list as Pakistan holds a higher comparative advantage over India along major items. Some top products are shown in the table below:

Textile and footwear:

The textile sector takes majority share in products protected by India under its Sensitive List. Of the 182 products, Pakistan holds a higher comparative advantage than India along 102 items, mainly apparel. Export potential along these products comes around to a 0.5 billion dollars which provides an indicator as to where Pakistan's potential lies. However, India applies fixed/specific duty (Rs./piece or Kg/Sq.mtr) along several items of fabric and apparel which makes levies paid much higher despite MFN duty applied. Such would counteract any advantage gained from removing these items from the sensitive list and would become an exercise in futility.

In the footwear sector, Pakistan does not have a comparative advantage along most items in India's sensitive list. Only one item: footwear made out of wood stands out where Pakistan has high potential to export and hold a comparative advantage as well.

Machinery:

India is not importing refrigerators or fans from Pakistan even though these products are largely being imported from countries such as China, Japan and Germany giving Pakistan a clear disadvantage. Pakistan is exporting these products to regional countries such as Bangladesh, Sri Lanka, Afghanistan and the Middle East. Pakistan also holds a comparative advantage along these products and given Pakistan's capacity to deliver, it could lobby to get these items removed from the Sensitive List.

7.0 Most Importable Items from India to Pakistan

Using the same methodology, we arrive at 758items (Annexure B) where India has both a higher RCA than Pakistan, and a higher potential to export to Pakistan. These 758 items are the most importable items from India. Of these, 261 items are those that are part of Pakistan's Sensitive and/or Negative Lists under SAFTA Phase II.

Sector wise distribution shows that share of Mineral Products has the highest import potential of 8.5 billion dollars (59.8.6%), followed by Chemical and Allied Products 1.3 billion dollars (9.1%), Vehicles 1.05 billion dollars (7.1 %) and Base Metals 0.7 billion dollars (5.2%).

The current import value of the 758 items is 0.9 billion dollars, which is merely 6% of the potential import value of 14.2 billion dollars. Pakistan could benefit from importing cheaper Machinery, Chemicals, Base Metals and Plastics & Rubber from India. Other Petroleum Oils is the most importable item with the highest import potential value of 8.4 billion dollars. At 8-digit HS code this consists of two major items: Furnace Oil and High Speed Diesel Oil. Pakistan imported furnace oil worth 5 billion dollars in 2012 and high speed diesel oil worth 3.2 billion dollars from the world. If Pakistan imports these items from India it would save on huge transportation costs, given that India can export the required quantities of oil to Pakistan and at prices lower than other partners. Most of India's refineries with surplus production are located near Pakistan's Punjab province and this could help reduce the cost of transportation from Karachi to the North of Pakistan. These items are not allowed via the Wagah-Attari border.

Automobiles (1000 cc to 1500 cc) and black tea are the second and third most importable items with import potential worth of 400 and 318 million dollars respectively. Both these items are in Pakistan's Sensitive List while Automobiles is also in Pakistan's Negative List.

7.1 Exclusion of Items from Pakistan's Sensitive and Negative Lists

There are 171 most importable items present in SAFTA Sensitive List for Pakistan. 164 items are present in the Negative List and are barred from import into Pakistan. Adjusting for items common to both the Sensitive and Negative List, there are in total 261 items that are under protection in the most importable items list. The current import value of these items is 136.6 million dollars whereas potential is 3.4 billion dollars. Once Pakistan reduces it Sensitive List down to a 100 items, India would ideally want these 171 items to not comprise of that list.

Top items that are protected but highly importable are Automobiles 1000 to 1500 cc, Automobiles not more than 1000 cc and Black Tea.

7.2 Concerns of local industries

Local producers in Pakistan are apprehensive of Indian imports especially in the agriculture, automotive and pharmaceutical sectors where they fear that cheaper Indian imports could significantly hurt their interests. The 758 items that are highly importable from India include items in these sectors where Agriculture has 3.9% share in total potential; Automotive has 6.9% while Pharmaceutical has 4%. Pakistani industrialists and agriculturalists would like the Government of Pakistan to do a competitive analysis of the Indian sectors as it is feared that cheaper Indian products supported by heavy subsidies (see Table 5) from the Indian side would irreparably damage the local industry. Subsidies include low cost of borrowing, cheaper cost of energy due to subsidies and investment incentives offered by India to its industries. However, Pakistan's strategy to retain items in the sensitive list and maintain a negative list as a means to protect domestic interests is rather short sighted. Instead, the government's immediate concern should be to bolster its protective and safeguard measures to ensure that the local industry is not harmed in the long run. This would entail empowering the National Tariff Commission (NTC) and other local regulatory bodies to construct a framework that would address the variety of anti-dumping, countervailing, safeguarding, certification, standardization and inspection matters on a timely basis. Appropriate restrictions need to accordingly placed and trade defence laws in line with the provisions offered under the WTO regulations should be used as tools to protect the local industry.

7.2.1 Agricultural Sector (HS 06-24)

The agriculture sector is not highly protected under Pakistan's Sensitive or Negative List. In fact, there are 30 vegetable items in the allowed list via Wagah-Attari border including potatoes, tomatoes, onion, garlic, ginger and sugar.

Amongst the most importable items from Indiain this sector, there are only 35items where India has significant capacity and potential to export to Pakistan and holds a higher comparative advantage than Pakistan.7 of these items are in Pakistan's Sensitive List. India's total potential to export to Pakistan along the 35 itemsis 561 million dollars while Pakistan is currently importing 381 million dollars' worth of produce from India. The local farmers fear an onslaught of Indian produce coming in once MFN is granted and the Wagah-Attari route is opened up that could potentially hurt sales of the local farmer.

India provides non product specific subsidies in the agricultural sector such as subsidizedirrigation networks, power, fertilizer and credit subsidiesand product specific subsidies in the form of subsidy schemessuch as Minimum Support Price (MSP) for principal crops (wheat, rice, cotton) and National Food Security Mission (NFSM) to increase productivity of rice, wheat and pulses¹⁴ among others. Fertilizer subsidy is nearly 1% of India's GDP. These greatly support the local farmerand sector as a whole to produce at lower costs and increase production leading to significantly lower prices. Once subsidized goods are exported to the Pakistani side, the local Pakistani producecould becomeuncompetitive in its own market.

Thismakes a weak case for tariff based protection as it is largely limiting in the long run. Even protected under the sensitive list, highly subsidized items coming in from India will be cheaper. Once MFN is granted, Indian produce would become highly importable. Adding and maintaining items to the protection lists hence, can only be a measure in the short run. Pakistan's strategy should be to harness its safeguard measures and construct a trade defence mechanism that would protect the local producer instead of relying on its sensitive list.

7.2.2 AutoSector (HS 87 and others)

The automotive sector is highly protected under the Sensitive and Negative Lists of Pakistan with many items overlaping between the two lists. This sector would most likely enjoy protection even after the Negative List is no longer operative. 25 items have been identified under this study that hold potential imports from India of 0.99 billion dollars. 23 of these items are protected by Pakistan. Pakistan is currently not allowing imports from India along this sector and is generally hesitant to open these tariff lines fearing tough competition from India's more established auto industry.

India is a cheaper alternative than Pakistan's current sources of import such as Japan and Thailand etc. Pakistan could utilize from the cost effectiveness of importing from India by importing auto parts and components, if not complete units in the auto sector that it is currently importing from more expensive sources.

7.2.3 Pharmaceutical Sector (HS 29)

This study has identified 129 items that India has a higher comparative advantage than Pakistan and a higher potential to export. This is not to say that the potential export itself is significant in terms of value. In fact, India's potential to export to Pakistan in this sector has a value of 594 million dollars whereas Pakistan currently imports about half of this value from India. Pakistan is protecting only 9 of these items under the Sensitive or the Negative List.

Products such as Penicillin, Sorbitol, Aromatic acids and Antibiotics that are part of both the protection lists of Pakistan are not being imported from the world in any significant quantities which indicates that the domestic demand is met by local manufacturing. If the industry fears dumping of Indian imports on granting of MFN status, these items could be maintained on the sensitive list in so long as industry develops the local competitiveness.


On the other hand, P-xylene that has the highest potential for India to export to Pakistan (314 million dollars) is not protected by Pakistan under any of its lists.

8.0 Barriers to Trade Normalization-An overview

Indices for trade restrictiveness (ORTI) calculated by the World Bank show that India's trade regime is more restrictive than its South Asian partners: Pakistan, Sri Lanka and Nepal. This method uses tariffs and non-tariff barriers employed by a country to calculate how restrictive its policies are when it comes to importing goods into its markets.

Similarly, a study commissioned by the EU identifies 33 trade restrictive measures for India as opposed to one for Pakistan in the time period of 2008 and 2013.

Pakistan has a much lower ratio of trade restrictiveness and it is mainly tariff based. In relations with India, Pakistan bars imports from its regional partner via a negative list (1209 items) and protects a significant number of product lines (936 items) with a sensitive list. In addition, only 137 product imports are allowed via land route. Tariff concessions under the SAFTA Trade Liberalization Programme (see summary below) are not applicable in full force on Indian imports because of the issue of MFN but these concessions would kick in once MFN is granted.

India adopts one of the world's most stringent standards of trade restrictiveness. Research indicates that India's Para tariff measures and NTBs defeat the purpose of SAFTA concessions and the MFN status awarded to Pakistan. This is because not only do Pakistani products become more expensive

via high levels of Para tariffs, exporters also face various barriers¹⁸ that make trading with India via formal channels extremely challenging. This gives rise to informal trade and trade through other countries such as Dubai which according to some estimations is as high as the current formal trade. In the latest meeting of the SAFTA Committee of Experts (COE), Pakistan notified as many as 31 Nontariff and tariff measures that Pakistani exporters face in India, insisting these are Pakistan-specific.

A second indicator is the Logistics Performance Index calculated by the World Bank. It shows that India's performance in terms of quality of logistics is much better than that of Pakistan, in fact best amongst South Asian countries. Indices for Pakistan show that the country needs to increase its level of efficiency in customs procedures.

8.1 Para-Tariff Measures


In India, basic duties on imports are charged at an ad valorem (as a fixed percentage) or specific tax (per unit) basis¹⁹. On textile and clothing, specific duties can exceed up to 100% especially on value-added textiles. Compared to specific duty, ad valorem rates are much lower. In addition, Para-tariffs on importing into India consist of CVD Additional Duty (or Countervailing Duty), Education Cess of Customs, Secondary and Higher Education (SAH) Cess of Customs and Special CVD. As shown in the example below, if customs duty is 10% on import into India, 18% is the additional duty charged.²⁰

Tariffs on goods imported from India into Pakistan are 25 comparatively lower than India's tariff on imports. Goods are mostly charged with ad valorem duties in the range of 0% to 30%. Some goods such as oil are charged with specific 15 duty. Additional Tariffs are also charged in Pakistan but on few products. On comparison, the average Para-Tariff applicable on the most exportable items to India is 15%, 5 while the average Para-tariff of the most importable items from India is 2.6%.²¹



Hence, India protects its local producer with basic customs duty or MFN (5% and 8% charged by India) plus a Special CVD (4%) applied on imported products. On the other hand, products coming into Pakistan from India are levied a basic customs duty alone whereas only in some cases, a GST or excise is applied.

8.2 Non-Tariff Barriers (NTBs) and their implications

It is evident from our calculations of potential exports to India, only 109 of the high potential 419 items were part of India's Sensitive List while the rest are not protected under this list. Majority of Pakistan's export potential lies in products that are not protected by SAFTA Sensitive List but are infact subject to Non-Tariff Barriers. Even if trade diversion were to occur after a reduction in the items on the Sensitive List as well as any decrease in Para-tariffs, the indelible issue of NTBs remains unaddressed.

It is a well-documented fact that some non-tariff barriers hurt Pakistani exporters more than exporters from other countries. The most common non-tariff measures are increased customs entry procedures, infrastructure constraints specially limitations in transport, SPS and TBT measures, financial measures and visa issues. While many of these have been identified and action may be taken in the near future to address them, many sector-specific NTBs will show up once Pakistan's exports to India increase. Below is a summary of some of the major NTBs that have been identified.

8.2.1 Technical Barriers to Trade (TBT)

Customs procedures such as quarantine check, customs clearance and rules of origin certification cause a lot of delays. Lack of tracking and tracing facilities, manual filing of goods in absence of Electronic Data Interchange facilities, unscheduled time lags and low quality of logistics services are all issues that are yet to be addressed. Quality standards in India for many products in Textile and Agriculture vary across states which makes meeting those standards more difficult. Several times the

origin of the goods is questioned at the Indian Customs. Quarantine checks also add to the delays which lead to goods stuck at the Customs for several days. When HS code classification of a certain product particularly in the sensitive or negative list varies from India and Pakistan, such is left at the discretion of the custom official.

SPS and TBT are tests carried out for protection of plant, human and animal life. India has a strict regime for quality and standards and currently has 24 standard setting bodies whereas Pakistan only has one. Pakistani exporters unaware of all the required standards, fail to comply with requirements posed by the Indian government on imports of several items. These certifications often take as long as six months. Whereas Pakistan accepts laboratory reports of textile items from India, such is not reciprocated.

Exporting Live Animals into India requires sanitary import permits and agricultural items require testing and quarantine; facilities of which are only available in Delhi and Mumbai. Exporters of textiles are required to attain a pre-shipment certificate on use of hazardous dyes while Leather exporters are required to submit samples of consignments to testing laboratories located away from the port of entry and require additional certification from the Indian veterinary department.²²

8.2.2 Transport, Transit and Informal Trade

Despite shared borders, there is only one road link to Attari/Wagah that allows transportation of goods and even this is limited to 137 items in the case of Pakistan. Other mediums are rail, sea (Mumbai-Karachi) and air (Delhi- Lahore and Mumbai- Karachi) but there is a limitation on the type of goods that are allowed via a particular medium of transport. For instance, Cement export to India is only allowed through rail. India does not allow goods from Pakistan to move through Bangladesh and Nepal.

Trade also takes the form of smuggling and routing goods through another country. Owing to underdeveloped infrastructural links, a portion of trade relies on indirect/circular routes such as Mumbai- Dubai- Karachi, Mumbai- Dubai- Bandar and Abbas- Afghanistan- Pakistan²³. Exporters from both countries find it easier to trade via Dubai because of less scrutiny though at the expense of a higher transaction cost.

At the land border, traders complain of time restrictions. Trade takes place only from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. at the Wagah border. The gate is closed at 4:00 p.m. for the border ceremony hence no trading can take place after the gate is closed. There is no warehousing facility on either side of the border. Trucks are stranded at the border customs posts for days and weeks, waiting in queue for customs clearance and because of physical checking; most times the border is congested. At a time, the Pakistani side can load/unload 30-40 trucks at Wagah; the Indian side can only accommodate two. Rail wagons are required to return empty when carrying goods across the borders and ships are required to touch a third-country port such as Dubai or Singapore which adds to the costs many times over.

Additionally, container trucks are not allowed to move across the borders making transportation more costly since all container shipments are moved via sea ports, increasing transportation costs as well as lead times for delivery. Where railway transportation could be used, it is largely limited by poor quality and maintenance of railways ²⁴.

Recently, Integrated Check Post (ICPs) was set up at the Attari border meant to streamline the checking procedures of goods going into India. These were expected to allow ten times more trucks through the borders. However as it became operational, India imposed restrictions on trucks with more than 10 wheels as well as on those of more than 40 tons capacity. Removing restrictions and then purposefully imposing other ones only invalidates the gains likely to occur from removal.

8.2.3 Banking and Visa

There are several major operational constraints that create unnecessary time delays. Pakistani and Indian banks are currently not set up across the borders which complicates payment procedures. While goods exported via land routes take less than a day, payments can be delayed for up to 30 days. Traders on both sides of the border face difficulty in terms of payment uncertainties, defaults and lack of a reliable dispute settlement system. Some banks in India do not recognize Letter of

Credit (L/Cs) from Pakistani banks. Payments are cleared through Asian Clearing Union (ACU) which is a time consuming process. In the absence of alternative mechanisms, traders lose advantage of proximity in payment delays and increased transactions costs due to credit constraints.

Visa is a major impediment for traders, especially those that are small scaled and are unable to secure SAARC visas. Pakistanis are required to obtain a sponsor certificate from a sponsor in India. The sponsor has to get the certificate attestated from a government official which is once again, time consuming. Moreover, traders applying for visa have to get a sponsor certificate for every city that they wish to visit. Other restrictions include using the same port for entry and exit;visa is granted for a limited number of cities (not more than 3 cities at a time) for a limited period of stay and are vehicle mode-specific.

A visa agreement was signed in September 2012 between the two countries that included provisions for multiple entry visitor visa, single entry visa via Wagah Attari and group tourist visa for not less than 10 days. However, the agreement does not cover many aspects of visa restrictions that create unnecessary hurdles. Police reporting in India for instance is a major hurdle. Visa criterion is not transparent and delays in attaining visa cause increased costs.

8.2.4 Communication barriers and perceptions

While businessmen and traders on both sides might be open to freer trade between Pakistan and India, the underlying trust deficit persists. In the past, trade has been largely dominated by other concerns and has been subject to added restrictions and scrutiny on account of issues relating to security, terrorism and line of control tensions. Lack of political commitment to separate trade from other issues has not only limited trade but paved the way to indirect trading patterns and increased cost of doing business. Such inflexibility has halted trade negotiations time and again. The bureaucratic mind-set is persistent amongst field workers and custom officials. Many times, they are found to be unhelpful especially when discretionary power allows them to make processes more difficult and time consuming.

It is therefore no surprise that a major hurdle to trade between Pakistan and India remains the insufficient and asymmetric distribution of knowledge and information. Communication gaps, lack of timely and updated information all contribute to trading difficulties. The changing sensitive and negative lists, duty structures, custom procedures and technical measures are seldom communicated to traders. Procedures at times are not uniform across products, sectors and locations within the country that adds to the confusion. Lack of phone service across borders, persistent security checks, limited modes of communication all put unnecessary constraint on traders willing to trade. There is no platform for trade grievances and issues are dealt on piecemeal basis.

Procedure standardization and institutionalization of systems is key within and across the borders. A lot of effort would be saved if both countries agreed on simplified, transparent mechanisms to disseminate timely information with open communication channels.

9.0 Notion of Reciprocity- End Note


Many economic studies over the years have attempted to answer the question of trade normalization between Pakistan and India using trade data. While managing to accurately identify areas where growth opportunities exist, the viability of whether they could lead to normalized trade can not be answered without addressing the barriers to trade that exist between the two countries.

India is globally known as a highly restrictive market, gradually opening up to freer trade with the world. However, the strategically placed non-tariff barriers - somespecific to sectors such as textile, automobiles and agriculture and others non-specific such as customs, visa regime, banking controls etc. -makes it considerably difficult for Pakistani products to reach the Indian market.

On the other hand, in fear of hurting its domestic interests from Indian products, Pakistan has maintained a negative list, disallowed imports of all but 137 items through the land route of the Wagah-Attari border and resisted granting India the MFN status. Recent sessions of composite dialogue between the two governments is encouraging but the decision to remove protective barriers put in by Pakistan remains under scrutiny and met with protest from local industries.

The uproar of local industries appears legitimate as it argues vulnerability. Grant of MFN status and opening up the Wagah-Attari border would allow all and sundry imports from India that will be cheaper than local products; while exports from Pakistan would still be met with India's non-tariff barriers that it contends are applied to all countries. This is the core problem of trade normalization- India's reciprocity is not extended to categorically addressing its non-tariff barriers. This adds to the inequitable protection that the two countries offer to their domestic producers. While India protects its interests through paratariffs and non-tariff measures, Pakistan's only protection is tariff-based.

The need therefore is forthe two governments to now move toward dialogue that does not feed the rhetoric. Government of Pakistan should negotiate to ensure a level playing field not only for its local manufacturers in their domestic markets but also while exporting to the Indian market. Equitable benefits can only be achieved if the two countries agree to trade on reciprocal basis.
